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PART 1 - GENERAL INFORMATION

1.1 Introduction

The bid solicitation is divided into seven parts plus attachments and annexes, as follows:

- Part 1 General Information: provides a general description of the requirement;
- Part 2 Bidder Instructions: provides the instructions, clauses and conditions applicable to the bid solicitation;
- Part 3 Bid Preparation Instructions: provides Bidders with instructions on how to prepare their bid;
- Part 4 Evaluation Procedures and Basis of Selection: indicates how the evaluation will be conducted, the evaluation criteria that must be addressed in the bid, and the basis of selection;
- Part 5 Certifications and Additional Information: includes the certifications and additional information to be provided;
- Part 6 Security, Financial and Other Requirements: includes specific requirements that must be addressed by Bidders; and
- Part 7 Resulting Contract Clauses: includes the clauses and conditions that will apply to any resulting contract.

The Annexes include the Requirement, the Basis of Payment, and the Electronic Payment Instruments.

1.2 Summary

The Department of National Defence (DND), equires equipment as detailed under Article 6.2 of the resulting contract clauses.

1.3 Debriefings

Bidders may request a debriefing on the results of the bid solicitation process. Bidders should make the request to the Contracting Authority within 15 working days from receipt of the results of the bid solicitation process. The debriefing may be in writing, by telephone or in person.

1.4 epost Connect service

This bid solicitation requires bidders to use the epost Connect service provided by Canada Post Corporation to transmit their bid electronically. Bidders must refer to Part 2 entitled Bidder Instructions, and Part 3 entitled Bid Preparation Instructions, of the bid solicitation, for further information.

PART 2 - BIDDER INSTRUCTIONS

2.1 Standard Instructions, Clauses and Conditions

All instructions, clauses and conditions identified in the bid solicitation by number, date and title are set out in the [Standard Acquisition Clauses and Conditions Manual](https://buyandsell.gc.ca/policy-and-guidelines/standard-acquisition-clauses-and-conditions-manual) (<https://buyandsell.gc.ca/policy-and-guidelines/standard-acquisition-clauses-and-conditions-manual>) issued by Public Works and Government Services Canada.

Bidders who submit a bid agree to be bound by the instructions, clauses and conditions of the bid solicitation and accept the clauses and conditions of the resulting contract.

The [2003](#) (2020-05-28), Standard Instructions - Goods or Services - Competitive Requirements, are incorporated by reference into and form part of the bid solicitation.

2.2 Submission of Bids

Bids must be submitted only to the Public Works and Government Services Canada (PWGSC) Bid Receiving Unit specified below by the date and time indicated on page 1 of the bid solicitation:

Only bids submitted using epost Connect service will be accepted. The Bidder must send an email requesting to open an epost Connect conversation to the following address:

Note: Bids will not be accepted if emailed directly to this email address. This email address is to be used to open an epost Connect conversation, as detailed in Standard Instructions [2003](#), or to send bids through an epost Connect message if the bidder is using its own licensing agreement for epost Connect.

It is the Bidder's responsibility to ensure the request for opening an epost Connect conversation is sent to the email address above at least six days before the solicitation closing date.

Bids transmitted by facsimile or hardcopy to PWGSC will not be accepted.

2.3 Enquiries - Bid Solicitation

All enquiries must be submitted in writing to the Contracting Authority no later than seven (7) calendar days before the bid closing date. Enquiries received after that time may not be answered.

Bidders should reference as accurately as possible the numbered item of the bid solicitation to which the enquiry relates. Care should be taken by Bidders to explain each question in sufficient detail in order to enable Canada to provide an accurate answer. Technical enquiries that are of a proprietary nature must be clearly marked "proprietary" at each relevant item. Items identified as "proprietary" will be treated as such except where Canada determines that the enquiry is not of a proprietary nature. Canada may edit the question(s) or may request that the Bidder do so, so that the proprietary nature of the question(s) is eliminated and the enquiry can be answered to all Bidders. Enquiries not submitted in a form that can be distributed to all Bidders may not be answered by Canada.

2.4 Applicable Laws

Any resulting contract must be interpreted and governed, and the relations between the parties determined, by the laws in force in Ontario.

Bidders may, at their discretion, substitute the applicable laws of a Canadian province or territory of their choice without affecting the validity of their bid, by deleting the name of the Canadian province or territory specified and inserting the name of the Canadian province or territory of their choice. If no change is made, it acknowledges that the applicable laws specified are acceptable to the Bidders.

2.5 Bid Challenge and Recourse Mechanisms

- (a) Several mechanisms are available to potential suppliers to challenge aspects of the procurement process up to and including contract award.
- (b) Canada encourages suppliers to first bring their concerns to the attention of the Contracting Authority. Canada's [Buy and Sell](#) website, under the heading "[Bid Challenge and Recourse Mechanisms](#)" contains information on potential complaint bodies such as:

- (c) Suppliers should note that there are **strict deadlines** for filing complaints, and the time periods vary depending on the complaint body in question. Suppliers should therefore act quickly when they want to challenge any aspect of the procurement process.

3.1 Bid Preparation Instructions

The Bidder must submit its bid electronically in accordance with section 08 of the 2003 standard instructions. The epost Connect system has a limit of 1GB per single message posted and a limit of 20GB per conversation.

The bid must be gathered per section and separated as follows:

Bids transmitted by facsimile or hardcopy will not be accepted.

Section I: Technical Bid

In their technical bid, bidders should explain and demonstrate how they propose to meet the requirements and how they will carry out the Work.

Section II: Financial Bid

PART 4 - EVALUATION PROCEDURES AND BASIS OF SELECTION

4.1 Evaluation Procedures

- (a) Bids will be assessed in accordance with the entire requirement of the bid solicitation including the technical and financial evaluation criteria.
- (b) An evaluation team composed of representatives of Canada will evaluate the bids.

4.1.1 Technical Evaluation

4.1.1.1. Mandatory Technical Criteria

The Bidder must demonstrate that their proposed equipment meets or exceeds the following Mandatory Technical Evaluation Criteria. For each specification listed, the bidder must include a reference to supporting technical documents included with their bid, such as literature, brochures and/or specifications for their proposed equipment, where it is clearly demonstrated that their proposed equipment meets the specification. If any of the equipment specification is missing from the supporting technical documentation, then the Bidder must provide a narrative to demonstrate how the equipment meets that particular specification.

MTC. 1	The proposed Private Mobile LTE system must include two complete Mobile Private LTE transmission sites capable of supporting up to one thousand simultaneous users each. One of the LTE transmission sites must be packaged to be man transportable and the other must be packaged in a trailer mounted configuration to work in an autonomous manner with the option to also be dismantled one man transportable. Both LTE transmission sites must be able to function both independently and in conjunction with each other, with and without the need for microwave antennas. In a combined configuration, both LTE transmission sites must be able to broadcast LTE signals and continue to work independently without interruption wherein one site becomes inoperable.	
MTC. 2	The proposed LTE system must allow for the provisioning and management of the subscriber base & SIM card configuration by the end user and be capable of operating on any of the LTE bands via swapping of radio modules. The Bidder must demonstrate they can provide one thousand SIM cards, which are secure with unique user keys and transport for this project. The provider must provide all details about the SIM card security, its key and algorithm in use. These SIM cards must be fabricated and provided by an accredited firm registered by the Global System for Mobile Communications Association (GSMA)	
MTC. 3	From a security standpoint, the mobile network vendor must offer commercially encrypted, fully portable private LTE solutions without the requirement to connect to a public domain or infrastructure of any kind.

MTC. 4	The proposed trailer mounted LTE system must be mounted on a trailer, possess a single 5000lbs axles with 225/75/D15 tires and wheels; four retractable stabilizers and a leveling bracket on the drawbar; an onboard battery bank of 12.24Wh (4 batteries AGM 8V); a converter 100VAC to 24VDC; possess a hydraulic folding mast between 30-40 feet of height; include a 5000KW diesel generator with a 200 liter fuel tank; have a 110VAC shore power connection; possess an electric brake system; a standard pickup truck tow point of 2 inches; and a PLC for remote monitoring.	
MTC. 5	The proposed LTE system must use small form factor radios (Small Cell or SDR), for which the weight (excluding antenna) should not exceed 10kg	
MTC. 6	The provider must demonstrate both expertise and experience in delivering both LTE trailer mounted and LTE man portable solutions and provide five specific examples delivered within the past two years. The provider must also demonstrate their Radio Frequencies (RF) engineering expertise and prove that they possess such expertise employed in house (not subcontracted/partnered), ensuring compliance with Health and Safety Code 6 and that the solution is engineered and registered IAW ISED regulations.	
MTC. 7	The provider must demonstrate that internally they possess both IP and RF engineering expertise and experience in the deployment of Mobile Private LTE network solutions. The provider must provide at least five Canadian references of Private Mobile LTE network solutions delivered in the past two years which were fully autonomous and not cloud based.	
MTC. 8	The provider must demonstrate experience in sourcing frequencies in the LTE bands (provide examples), demonstrate that they already own frequencies with the 3GPP, and be capable of obtaining such frequencies bands for the Ottawa region.	
MTC. 9	The provider must provide the Private Mobile LTE solution with a Canadian PLMN who has all accreditations with the CRTC for LTE operations. The provider must provide the CRTC registration and certificates along with the Canadian PLMN which will be used for this project.	
MTC. 10	The Radio Access Network (RAN) solution must be compatible with 4G and 5G technologies, without the requirements to replace and reconfigure any components or parts, and be modular, allowing for simple replacement of the radio emitters at the user level (hot swappable).	
MTC.11	The Bidder must demonstrate expertise and experience in the deployment of portable communications networks integrated into WGS and TELESAT systems by providing examples of such deployments and integration.	

4.1.2 Financial Evaluation

4.1.2.1 Mandatory Financial Criteria

Any bid which fails to meet the following mandatory financial criteria will be deemed nonresponsive and will receive no further consideration:

- a) Bids must not contain any alteration to Annex "B" - Basis of Payment, other than the addition of the Manufacturer and Model information for the Item and the Bidder's firm unit pricing for all items. Bidders must provide the manufacturer and model information and the firm unit pricing for all items in their bid.
- b) Bids must not contain any condition or qualification placed upon the bid.
- c) Pricing must be firm in Canadian currency, excluding applicable taxes, and must not be indexed or tied to an escalation factor.
- d) Pricing must be provided for all items as listed in the Pricing Basis. If the Bidder leaves any price blank, Canada will treat the price as "\$0.00" for evaluation purposes and may request that the Bidder confirm that the price is, in fact, \$0.00. No Bidder will be permitted to add or change a price as part of this confirmation. Any Bidder who does not confirm that the price for a blank item is \$0.00 will be declared non-responsive.

4.1.2.2 Financial Evaluation

The price of the bid will be evaluated in Canadian dollars, Applicable Taxes excluded, Delivered Duty Paid, Canadian customs duties and excise taxes included.

The Bidder's Firm Unit Price will be multiplied by the quantity to calculate the extended pricing.

The Evaluated Price, used to determine lowest bid, will be the sum of the extended pricing of Annex B.

4.2 Basis of Selection

A bid must comply with all requirements of the bid solicitation and meet all mandatory technical evaluation criteria and financial evaluation criteria to be declared responsive. The responsive bid with the lowest evaluated price will be recommended for award of a contract.

PART 5 – CERTIFICATIONS AND ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

Bidders must provide the required certifications and additional information to be awarded a contract.

The certifications provided by Bidders to Canada are subject to verification by Canada at all times. Unless specified otherwise, Canada will declare a bid non-responsive, or will declare a contractor in default if any certification made by the Bidder is found to be untrue, whether made knowingly or unknowingly, during the bid evaluation period or during the contract period.

The Contracting Authority will have the right to ask for additional information to verify the Bidder's certifications. Failure to comply and to cooperate with any request or requirement imposed by the Contracting Authority will render the bid non-responsive or constitute a default under the Contract.

5.1 Certifications Required with the Bid

Bidders must submit the following duly completed certifications as part of their bid.

5.1.1 Integrity Provisions - Declaration of Convicted Offences

5.2 Certifications Precedent to Contract Award and Additional Information

If any of these required certifications or additional information is not completed and submitted as requested, the Contracting Authority will inform the Bidder of a time frame within which to provide the information. Failure to provide the certifications or the additional information listed below within the time frame specified will render the bid non-responsive.

ANNEX "A", REQUIREMENT

1 REQUIREMENT

1.1 DND has a requirement for a tactical, stand-alone, small form factor, ready portable and remotely deployable, independently powered, high-speed private LTE voice and data solution, which is fully integrated and compatible with existing TELESAT architecture. The solution must allow for the provisioning and management of the subscriber base & SIM card configuration by the end user and be capable of operating on any of the LTE bands via swapping of radio modules. From a security standpoint, the mobile network vendor must offer commercially encrypted, fully portable private LTE solutions without the requirement to connect to a public domain or infrastructure of any kind. In addition, the equipment must directly interface with existing SATCOM architecture facilitating integration and alleviating re-engineering of a specific solution requiring additional resources and costs. The equipment must be trailer mounted, possess an antenna mast and include a diesel generator capable of powering the system for a minimum of 72 hours.

1.2 The proposed Private Mobile LTE system must include two complete Mobile Private LTE transmission sites capable of supporting up to one thousand simultaneous users each. Both LTE transmission sites must accordingly possess an EPC, BBU and RRU. The RRU must be "hot swappable" depending on the operating LTE band, and have an emitting power of between 5-10Watts. The EPC must be able to run on a small form factor computer with the capability to run KVM and VMWare and include the following components: HSS, HME, PGW, SGW, PCRF and IMS. The EMS IMS must allow for voice calls (VoLTE) between the LTE users and across both sites when interconnected, allowing for up to one thousand users simultaneously, licensed accordingly. Both LTE transmissions sites configurations must be compatible with the following developmental frequencies: 700 MHz (b14/n14) and 900 MHz (b8/n8). Both LTE transmissions sites must be fully compliant with the 3GPP standard, with all ISDE (ISED) standards, and compliant with health and safety Canada (Code 6). The LTE solutions must use a Canadian Public Land Mobile Network (PLMN) which is registered with the Canadian Radio-Television and Telecommunications (CRTC). The LTE solution must include an IP67 certified LTE modem for remote rebroadcasting of the LTE network. Both LTE transmission sites must each possess two antennas, one high gain omni-directional antenna capable of working between 11/13dBi, 698-969Mhz, 4 ports, 65deg/65deg sectorial, and one dual band antenna, 2 ports, Planar XPol 35deg panel. Both LTE solutions must include all packaging, cabling, and commissioning of the systems.

1.3 The proposed LTE system must be a portable and remotely deployable, independently powered, high-speed private LTE voice and data solution, which is fully compatible, integrated and optimized for use on both the Wideband Global SATCOM (WGS) system and TELESAT's constellation as a private backhaul as required.

1.4 The Proposed system must be optimized for reduced latency links and directly interface with existing SATCOM architecture facilitating integration and alleviating re-engineering of a specific solution requiring additional resources and costs.

2 Personnel and Training Requirements

The Contractor must provide one (1) training session for up to 3 people within 30 days delivery and acceptance of the goods, and one additional training session for up to three (3) people within 12 months delivery and acceptance of the goods. Training is to include both operator, and operator maintenance training.
