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PART 1 - GENERAL INFORMATION

1.1 Requirement

The requirement is detailed under Article 6.2 of the resulting contract clauses.

1.2 Debriefings

Bidders may request a debriefing on the results of the bid solicitation process. Bidders should make the request to the Contracting Authority within 15 working days from receipt of the results of the bid solicitation process. The debriefing may be in writing, by telephone or in person.

PART 2 - BIDDER INSTRUCTIONS

2.3 Enquiries - Bid Solicitation

All enquiries must be submitted in writing to the Contracting Authority no later than 7 calendar days before the bid closing date. Enquiries received after that time may not be answered.

Bidders should reference as accurately as possible the numbered item of the bid solicitation to which the enquiry relates. Care should be taken by Bidders to explain each question in sufficient detail in order to enable Canada to provide an accurate answer. Technical enquiries that are of a proprietary nature must be clearly marked "proprietary" at each relevant item. Items identified as "proprietary" will be treated as such except where Canada determines that the enquiry is not of a proprietary nature. Canada may edit the question(s) or may request that the Bidder do so, so that the proprietary nature of the question(s) is eliminated, and the enquiry can be answered to all Bidders. Enquiries not submitted in a form that can be distributed to all Bidders may not be answered by Canada.

2.4 Applicable Laws

Any resulting contract must be interpreted and governed, and the relations between the parties determined, by the laws in force in Manitoba.

Bidders may, at their discretion, substitute the applicable laws of a Canadian province or territory of their choice without affecting the validity of their bid, by deleting the name of the Canadian province or territory specified and inserting the name of the Canadian province or territory of their choice. If no change is made, it acknowledges that the applicable laws specified are acceptable to the Bidders.

2.5 Bid Challenge and Recourse Mechanisms

4.2 Basis of Selection

4.2.1 Basis of Selection – Mandatory Technical Criteria

ANNEX "A"

REQUIREMENT

INFANT RADIANT WARMER

Background:

An infant radiant warmer is required for neonatal thermoregulation/resuscitation in a remote First Nations nursing station near High Level, Alberta. Pediatricians, physicians, or neonatal nurses do not routinely provide services in this location and the unit can be used for eight (8) hours or longer to provide infant stabilization for oxygen and heat until the infant can be transported out or specialist teams can arrive into the community. The warmer is not used frequently (6 to 8 times per year) but needs to be robust enough to function reliably when it is needed. Due to its infrequent use, the dusty environment, and rotating nursing and paramedic staff within the nursing station, the warmer must be easy to use with fewer interactive parts.

Mandatory Performance Specifications

- Must be a portable/stand-alone unit on casters.
- Oxygen and air capacity must be portable (not wall mounted).
- Must include applicable oxygen and air hoses, 4' to 6' long
- Must include applicable oxygen and air connectors
- Must have an elevating base
- Must include an aimable procedure light
- Must include an in-bed scale
- Must include a storage drawer
- Must include probe panel and necessary power cords and cables
- Must be fully functional within 5 minutes or less from being connected to power source.
- Must have an Intravenous (IV) dual hook 12
- Power cords, air and oxygen inlets and any other items for the basic system to be functional
- Must be a T-piece resuscitation system with blended high pressure
- Must have suction capabilities
- Must have the ability to monitor neo temperature
- Starter Supplies that must be included with the equipment:
 - Disposable patient probes
 - Disposable circuits (with or without masks)
- Must supply or refer to a vendor who can supply consumable supplies and replacement parts for future purchase.
- DVD or online installation and operating instructions must be included with the equipment

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Technical Support and Updates

- Must provide access to 24/7 technical support via phone or online technology
- Must provide updates on any problems encountered and recommended options
- Must provide immediate notice should the equipment be recalled

Training

Virtual training must be delivered to for up to 10 end users. The virtual training will be arranged between Fox Lake Nursing Station and the Contractor.

Repair Services

The contractor must provide the name and contact information of a certified repair technician qualified to perform repairs on the equipment

Failure to comply with the request of the Contracting Authority within that time period, will deem the bid non-responsive and the bid will be given no further consideration.

In order to facilitate the evaluation of the bid, Canada requests that bidders address and present the topics in the order of the evaluation criteria, and include a grid in their proposal, containing the information which demonstrates how the bidder meets each evaluation criteria. Alternatively, and to avoid any duplication, bidders may also refer to the different sections of their bids by identifying the specific paragraph and page number where the subject topic has already been addressed.
8. Bidders must address any concerns with the performance specifications in written detail to the Contracting Authority before bid closing as outlined in the Request for Proposal (RFP) document.
