


Further to the above-mentioned Invitation to Tender, this **Addendum #3** is to advise potential bidders of the following questions and answers received to date.

Q1. As an alternative to a security deposit an irrevocable standby letter of credit is acceptable to Canada?

R1: Yes, a letter of credit is acceptable by Canada as form of security deposit as per GI08(2018-06-21).

Q2: For the number of handrail posts for the top platform, according to this note which says 65 vertical centres, this does seem a little too close?





R2: The 65 vertical centers refers to the bolt spacing indicated below. 65mm spacing between bolts, arranged vertically and centered on the web of the C152 x 64 x 6.4 channel.

Q3: For note 9 under the heading 'Structural Aluminum' it says do not splice sections. Does that mean that all tubes/channels need to be the exact length the drawing says? For example, there are some channel and tube pieces that are roughly 13-16 feet long, are welds/seams permitted if we are not able to get full length material?

R3: Structural aluminum sections must be continuous. Splicing is not permitted.

Q4: On page one the two towers are delivered to Prescott. In the documents one is going to Prescott and the other to Parry Sound?

R4: One delivered to Prescott base. The other tower delivered to Parry Sound.
