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PART 1 - GENERAL INFORMATION

1.1 Introduction

The bid solicitation is divided into six parts plus attachments and annexes, as follows:

- Part 1 General Information: provides a general description of the requirement;
- Part 2 Bidder Instructions: provides the instructions, clauses and conditions applicable to the bid solicitation;
- Part 3 Bid Preparation Instructions: provides Bidders with instructions on how to prepare their bid;
- Part 4 Evaluation Procedures and Basis of Selection: indicates how the evaluation will be conducted, the evaluation criteria that must be addressed in the bid, and the basis of selection;
- Part 5 Certifications and Additional Information: includes the certifications and additional information to be provided;
- Part 6 Resulting Contract Clauses: includes the clauses and conditions that will apply to any resulting contract.

The Annexes include the Requirement, the Basis of Payment and the Electronic Payment Instruments.

1.2 Summary

The Department of National Defence (DND) has a requirement for the supply of material to build a tunnel system.

Delivery must be completed on or before 31 March 2021.

The requirement is detailed under Article 6.2 of the resulting contract clauses.

1.3 Debriefings

Bidders may request a debriefing on the results of the bid solicitation process. Bidders should make the request to the Contracting Authority within 15 working days from receipt of the results of the bid solicitation process. The debriefing may be in writing, by telephone or in person.

1.4 epost Connect service

This bid solicitation requires bidders to use the epost Connect service provided by Canada Post Corporation to transmit their bid electronically. Bidders must refer to Part 2 entitled Bidder Instructions, and Part 3 entitled Bid Preparation Instructions, of the bid solicitation, for further information.

PART 2 - BIDDER INSTRUCTIONS

2.1 Standard Instructions, Clauses and Conditions

All instructions, clauses and conditions identified in the bid solicitation by number, date and title are set out in the [Standard Acquisition Clauses and Conditions Manual](https://buyandsell.gc.ca/policy-and-guidelines/standard-acquisition-clauses-and-conditions-manual) (<https://buyandsell.gc.ca/policy-and-guidelines/standard-acquisition-clauses-and-conditions-manual>) issued by Public Works and Government Services Canada.

Bidders who submit a bid agree to be bound by the instructions, clauses and conditions of the bid solicitation and accept the clauses and conditions of the resulting contract.

2.2 Submission of Bids

Bids must be submitted only to the Public Works and Government Services Canada (PWGSC) Bid Receiving Unit specified below by the date and time indicated on page 1 of the bid solicitation:

Only bids submitted using epost Connect service will be accepted. The Bidder must send an email requesting to open an epost Connect conversation to the following address:

Note: Bids will not be accepted if emailed directly to this email address. This email address is to be used to open an epost Connect conversation, as detailed in Standard Instructions [2003](#), or to send bids through an epost Connect message if the bidder is using its own licensing agreement for epost Connect.

It is the Bidder's responsibility to ensure the request for opening an epost Connect conversation is sent to the email address above at least six days before the solicitation closing date.

Bids transmitted by facsimile or hardcopy to PWGSC will not be accepted.

2.3 Enquiries - Bid Solicitation

All enquiries must be submitted in writing to the Contracting Authority no later than two (2) calendar days before the bid closing date. Enquiries received after that time may not be answered.

Bidders should reference as accurately as possible the numbered item of the bid solicitation to which the enquiry relates. Care should be taken by Bidders to explain each question in sufficient detail in order to enable Canada to provide an accurate answer. Technical enquiries that are of a proprietary nature must be clearly marked "proprietary" at each relevant item. Items identified as "proprietary" will be treated as such except where Canada determines that the enquiry is not of a proprietary nature. Canada may edit the question(s) or may request that the Bidder do so, so that the proprietary nature of the question(s) is eliminated and the enquiry can be answered to all Bidders. Enquiries not submitted in a form that can be distributed to all Bidders may not be answered by Canada.

2.4 Applicable Laws

Any resulting contract must be interpreted and governed, and the relations between the parties determined, by the laws in force in Ontario.

Bidders may, at their discretion, substitute the applicable laws of a Canadian province or territory of their choice without affecting the validity of their bid, by deleting the name of the Canadian province or territory specified and inserting the name of the Canadian province or territory of their choice. If no change is made, it acknowledges that the applicable laws specified are acceptable to the Bidders.

2.5 Bid Challenge and Recourse Mechanisms

- (a) Several mechanisms are available to potential suppliers to challenge aspects of the procurement process up to and including contract award.

PART 4 - EVALUATION PROCEDURES AND BASIS OF SELECTION

4.1 Evaluation Procedures

- (a) Bids will be assessed in accordance with the entire requirement of the bid solicitation including the technical and financial evaluation criteria.
- (b) An evaluation team composed of representatives of Canada will evaluate the bids.

4.1.1 Technical Evaluation

4.1.1.1. Mandatory Technical Criteria

The Bidder must demonstrate that their proposed equipment meets or exceeds the following Mandatory Technical Evaluation Criteria. For each specification listed, the bidder must include a reference to supporting technical documents included with their bid, such as literature, brochures and/or specifications for their proposed equipment, where it is clearly demonstrated that their proposed equipment meets the specification. If any of the equipment specification is missing from the supporting technical documentation, then the Bidder must provide a narrative to demonstrate how the equipment meets that particular specification.

4.1.2 Financial Evaluation

4.1.2.1 Mandatory Financial Criteria

Any bid which fails to meet the following mandatory financial criteria will be deemed nonresponsive and will receive no further consideration:

a) Bids must not contain any alteration to Annex "B" - Basis of Payment, other than the addition of the Manufacturer and Model information for the Item and the Bidder's firm unit pricing for all items. Bidders must provide the manufacturer and model information and the firm unit pricing for the all items in their bid.

b) Bids must not contain any condition or qualification placed upon the bid.

- c) Pricing must be firm in Canadian currency, excluding applicable taxes, and must not be indexed or tied to an escalation factor.
- d) Pricing must be provided for all items as listed in the Pricing Basis. If the Bidder leaves any price blank, Canada will treat the price as "\$0.00" for evaluation purposes and may request that the Bidder confirm that the price is, in fact, \$0.00. No Bidder will be permitted to add or change a price as part of this confirmation. Any Bidder who does not confirm that the price for a blank item is \$0.00 will be declared non-responsive.

4.1.2.2 Financial Evaluation

The price of the bid will be evaluated in Canadian dollars, Applicable Taxes excluded, Delivered Duty Paid, Canadian customs duties and excise taxes included.

For each Item, the Bidder's Unit Price will be multiplied by the Quantity to calculate the Extended Price. The sum of the Extended Price of all Items will be the Bidder's Evaluated Price.

4.2 Basis of Selection

A bid must comply with all requirements of the bid solicitation and meet all mandatory technical evaluation criteria and financial evaluation criteria to be declared responsive. The responsive bid with the lowest evaluated price will be recommended for award of a contract.

PART 5 – CERTIFICATIONS AND ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

Bidders must provide the required certifications and additional information to be awarded a contract.

The certifications provided by Bidders to Canada are subject to verification by Canada at all times. Unless specified otherwise, Canada will declare a bid non-responsive, or will declare a contractor in default if any certification made by the Bidder is found to be untrue, whether made knowingly or unknowingly, during the bid evaluation period or during the contract period.

The Contracting Authority will have the right to ask for additional information to verify the Bidder's certifications. Failure to comply and to cooperate with any request or requirement imposed by the Contracting Authority will render the bid non-responsive or constitute a default under the Contract.

5.1 Certifications Required with the Bid

Bidders must submit the following duly completed certifications as part of their bid.

ANNEX "A"

REQUIREMENT

1. SCOPE

- 1.1. Purpose. The Department of National Defence (DND) has a requirement for the supply of material to build a tunnel system for development of tunnel clearance Training, Techniques and Practices (TTP's). This will enhance DND's capability and effect during current and future operational tunnel clearance operations.
- 1.2. Background. DND has used a substandard Combat Engineer Regiment (CER) owned tunnel system in the past. The tunnel system is currently condemned, has no projected future maintenance, and provides limited training value. The current training venue is not suitable for DND's operational requirements.

2. REQUIREMENTS

- 2.1. Technical Requirements. The tunnel system must consist of the following items: Box culvert, HDPE culvert pipe, Corrugation Profile Nestable Pipe. Each specified material must meet these minimum requirements:
- 2.2. Box Culvert
 - 2.2.1. Must have minimum dimensions of: 10 ft wide, 5 ft high (from finished grade to ceiling height), 24 ft long;
 - 2.2.2. Must be able to withstand a burial depth of up to 4 ft.;
 - 2.2.3. Must be able to accommodate light vehicle traffic along top of structure (minimum weight 1000 lbs);
 - 2.2.4. Must include an email drawing with details pertaining to ground preparation requirements and placement of structure on sandy soil. The email drawing must be provided to the Contracting Authority prior to Contract Award. The Contractor must provide this email within two (2) business days after requested from the Contract Authority;
 - 2.2.5. Must have 1 x access point on the top, in the form of a hatch door or opening, with the diameter no less than 36 inches;
 - 2.2.6. Must include all assembly components. Must include pre cast footings to run the entire length on both sides;
 - 2.2.7. Style must be: C type, Box, or open bottom box culvert with pre cast footings with one set per section to run entire length of section;

- 2.2.8. Supplier is responsible for delivery and offload to specified location in CFB Petawawa.

2.3. HDPE Culvert Pipe

- 2.3.1. Must be a minimum of: 36 inch diameter with all end seals provided, at a length of 30 feet;
- 2.3.2. Must include 1 x compatible HDPE culvert pipe T intersection with all intersecting portions being same as supplied pipe diameter;
- 2.3.3. Must include 3 x compatible culvert pipe coupler;
- 2.3.4. Must be able to withstand full burial depth of a minimum 4-6" beyond the height of the pipe and light foot traffic, minimum of 300 lbs.;
- 2.3.5. Can be either smooth or ribbed style pipe;
- 2.3.6. Supplier is responsible for delivery to specified location in CFB Petawawa.

2.4. 68mm x 13mm Corrugation Profile Nestable Pipe

- 2.4.1. Must be 1600mm span x 800mm rise half arch nestable culvert;
- 2.4.2. Must be a minimum of: 9.75m long by 2.8mm thick;
- 2.4.3. Must include all necessary hardware and anchors for installation;
- 2.4.4. Must provide a Canada approved engineered stamped assembly drawing / instructions and sub-base requirements to facilitate construction. This must be provided prior to Contract Award to the Contracting Authority. The Contractor must provide this drawing/instructions within two (2) business days after requested from the Contract Authority. At a minimum this must include:
- 2.4.4.1 Preparation work required to prevent it from sinking on sand;
- 2.4.4.2 Type or grade of fill required;
- 2.4.4.3 Width and depth of fill to be placed;
- 2.4.4.4 How often fill will need to be compacted for placement on sandy soil.
- 2.4.5. Supplier is responsible for delivery and offload to specified location in CFB Petawawa.

- 2.5. Technical Drawing. See Electronic [Attachment – Attachment 1 to Annex "A" - Technical Drawings](#) with technical drawings for the tunnel system material.

- 2.6. DND will organize and coordinate the placement and installation of materials from offload location to final assembly area with no requirement from supplier beyond the offload point.
