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Marine Fleet

350 active vessels across the country, approximately \$ 40 M in assets

Overall Staffing Level

Vessels are operated by members in detachments (Basic or Advanced Water Operator Trained)

West Coast Marine Services in Nanaimo supports the Patrol Vessels

Supported by Fleet Managers in each Division, technically supported by 2 Marine Technicians for the country



Marine Mission – Mandate

Support to Contract and Aboriginal Policing through enforcement of Criminal Code and Provincial Statutes

Support to Federal Operations including Shiprider, Integrated Border Enforcement, National Underwater Recovery Team (URT) Training and Operations, National Emergency Response Team (ERT) Training and Operations and Maritime Port Security

RCMP- Led Interdepartmental Marine Fleet Low/Zero-Emission Initiative

- Greening Government Fund Initiative - Projects that will result in immediate GHG emissions reductions in federal operations
- This project seeks funding to explore the feasibility of low/zero-emission internal combustion engine (ICE) on small boats
- The initial phase of the program will be project definition in FY 21/22. This phase will include a Request for Information (RFI) to allow for industry input.
