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PART 1 - GENERAL INFORMATION

1.1 Security Requirements

There is no security requirement applicable to the Contract.

1.2 Requirement

Transport Canada requires the repair and overhaul of an Auxiliary Power Unit (APU) P/N 160370-100 S/N 787305 in accordance with the Statement of Work at Annex 'A'.

1.2.1 Estimated Delivery

While Canada requests delivery by July 2, 2021, the best delivery offered by the bidder is _____ days after receipt of the APU from Transport Canada.

1.3 Debriefings

Bidders may request a debriefing on the results of the bid solicitation process. Bidders should make the request to the Contracting Authority within 15 working days from receipt of the results of the bid solicitation process. The debriefing may be in writing, by telephone or in person.

1.4 Trade Agreements

The requirement is subject to the provisions of the Canadian Free Trade Agreement (CFTA).

PART 2 - BIDDER INSTRUCTIONS

2.1 Standard Instructions, Clauses and Conditions

All instructions, clauses and conditions identified in the bid solicitation by number, date and title are set out in the [Standard Acquisition Clauses and Conditions Manual](https://buyandsell.gc.ca/policy-and-guidelines/standard-acquisition-clauses-and-conditions-manual) (<https://buyandsell.gc.ca/policy-and-guidelines/standard-acquisition-clauses-and-conditions-manual>) issued by Public Works and Government Services Canada.

Bidders who submit a bid agree to be bound by the instructions, clauses and conditions of the bid solicitation and accept the clauses and conditions of the resulting contract.

The 2003 (2020-05-28) Standard Instructions - Goods or Services - Competitive Requirements, are incorporated by reference into and form part of the bid solicitation.

2.2 Submission of Bids

Bids must be submitted only to Public Works and Government Services Canada (PWGSC) Bid Receiving Unit by the date, time and place indicated on page 1 of the bid solicitation.

2.3 Enquiries - Bid Solicitation

All enquiries must be submitted in writing to the Contracting Authority no later than five (5) calendar days before the bid closing date. Enquiries received after that time may not be answered.

Bidders should reference as accurately as possible the numbered item of the bid solicitation to which the enquiry relates. Care should be taken by Bidders to explain each question in sufficient detail in order to enable Canada to provide an accurate answer. Technical enquiries that are of a proprietary nature must be clearly marked "proprietary" at each relevant item. Items identified as "proprietary" will be treated as such except where Canada determines that the enquiry is not of a proprietary nature. Canada may edit the question(s) or may request that the Bidder do so, so that the proprietary nature of the question(s) is eliminated, and the enquiry can be answered to all Bidders. Enquiries not submitted in a form that can be distributed to all Bidders may not be answered by Canada.

2.4 Applicable Laws

Any resulting contract must be interpreted and governed, and the relations between the parties determined, by the laws in force in Ontario.

Bidders may, at their discretion, substitute the applicable laws of a Canadian province or territory of their choice without affecting the validity of their bid, by deleting the name of the Canadian province or territory specified and inserting the name of the Canadian province or territory of their choice. If no change is made, it acknowledges that the applicable laws specified are acceptable to the Bidders.

PART 3 - BID PREPARATION INSTRUCTIONS

3.1 Bid Preparation Instructions

Canada requests that Bidders provide their bid in separately bound sections as follows:

Section I: Financial Bid (1 copy)

Section II: Certifications (1 copy)

Prices must appear in the financial bid only. No prices must be indicated in any other section of the bid.

Canada requests that Bidders follow the format instructions described below in the preparation of their bid:

- (a) use 8.5 x 11 inch (216 mm x 279 mm) paper;
- (b) use a numbering system that corresponds to the bid solicitation.

To assist Canada in reaching its objectives, Bidders should:

- 1) use 8.5 x 11 inch (216 mm x 279 mm) paper containing fibre certified as originating from a sustainably-managed forest and containing minimum 30% recycled content; and
- 2) use an environmentally-preferable format including black and white printing instead of colour printing, printing double sided/duplex, using staples or clips instead of cerlox, duotangs or binders.

Section I: Financial Bid

Bidders must submit their financial bid in accordance with the Basis of Payment and the Line Item Detail. The total amount of Applicable Taxes must be shown separately.

Section II: Certifications

Bidders must submit the certifications and additional information required under Part 5.

3.1.2 Airworthiness Certification

The requirements for airworthiness certification do not apply to the provision of standard and commercial parts. Standard and commercial parts must be accompanied by a packing slip that identifies the name and address of the supplier, the stock number, identification of the manufacturing standard (e.g. SAE, NAS, AN, MS) and/or manufacturer's part number and model number as applicable; quantity, identification of the lot or batch number if applicable; and the cure date/shelf life if applicable.

Bidders are advised that it will be a requirement to provide with each item, supplied under the resulting Contract, a Certificate of Conformance, or certified true copies as specified herein:

1. Parts must have an Original Equipment Manufacturer (OEM) or an OEM's approved manufacturer's Certificate of Conformance, which includes all the following information:

- a) positive identification of the item by type, class, style, grade, model, part number, description, nomenclature and/or serial number, as applicable;
- b) either the following certification, or a similarly worded statement, signed by an authorized inspector, that satisfies the intent of the following:
"I certify that the aeronautical product described here conforms to the applicable design data and is in a condition for safe operations."
- c) identification of both the authorized signatory and the organization.

2. Parts which have an application to a civilian type certified aircraft must be supplied with a Certificate of Conformance, namely:

- a) form TCCA 24-0078, Authorized Release Certificate, signed by a TC authorized inspector, within the two (2) years before contract award;
- b) FAA Form 8130-3, Airworthiness Approval Tag, or a FAA Form 8130-4, Export Certificate of Airworthiness, signed by a FAA authorized inspector, within the two (2) years before contract award;

c) Joint Aviation Authorities (JAA) Form One, Authorized Release Certificate, signed by a JAA authorized inspector, within the two (2) years before contract award;

d) European Aviation Safety Agency (EASA) Form One, Authorized Release Certificate, signed by an EASA authorized inspector, within the two (2) years before contract award; or

e) OEM's or OEM's approved manufacturer's Certificate of Conformance; which includes:

positive identification of the item by type, class style, grade, model, part number, description, nomenclature, and/or serial number, as applicable;

either the following certification, or a similarly worded statement, signed by an authorized inspector, that satisfies the intent of the following:

"I certify that the aeronautical product described here conforms to the applicable design data and is in a condition for safe operations".

f) identification of both the authorized signatory and organization.

3. Bidders must specify which one of the documents identified above will be provided for each item required to be supplied in response to the bid solicitation.

PART 4 - EVALUATION PROCEDURES AND BASIS OF SELECTION

4.1 Evaluation Procedures

(a) Bids will be assessed in accordance with the entire requirement of the bid.

(b) An evaluation team composed of representatives of Canada will evaluate the bids.

4.1.1 Financial Evaluation

Bidders must submit their financial bid in accordance with the requirements detailed at 'Line Item Detail.'

4.1.2 Evaluation of Price

1. The price of the bid will be evaluated in Canadian dollars, Applicable Taxes excluded, FCA (Contractor's facility), Canadian customs duties and excise taxes extra.
2. Unless the bid solicitation specifically requires bids to be submitted in Canadian currency, bids submitted in foreign currency will be converted to Canadian currency for evaluation purposes. The rate given by the Bank of Canada in effect on the bid solicitation closing date, or on another date specified in the bid solicitation, will be applied as a conversion factor to the bids submitted in foreign currency.
3. Bids will be assessed on a Free Carrier (FCA) basis. All delivery transportation/shipping costs of the repaired/overhauled unit are to be paid by Transport Canada, including payment of customs duties, via FedEx account.
4. Cost of transporting the unit to be repaired/overhauled to the Contractor's facility will be the responsibility of Transport Canada.

4.2 Basis of Selection

- 4.2.1 A bid must comply with all requirements of the bid solicitation to be declared responsive. The responsive bid with the lowest evaluated price will be recommended for award of a contract.

PART 5 – CERTIFICATIONS AND ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

Bidders must provide the required certifications and additional information to be awarded a contract.

The certifications provided by Bidders to Canada are subject to verification by Canada at all times. Unless specified otherwise, Canada will declare a bid non-responsive, or will declare a contractor in default if any certification made by the Bidder is found to be untrue whether made knowingly or unknowingly, during the bid evaluation period or during the contract period.

The Contracting Authority will have the right to ask for additional information to verify the Bidder's certifications. Failure to comply and to cooperate with any request or requirement imposed by the Contracting Authority will render the bid non-responsive or constitute a default under the Contract.

5.1 Certifications Required with the Bid

Bidders must submit the following duly completed certifications as part of their bid.

5.1.1 Integrity Provisions - Declaration of Convicted Offences

In accordance with the Integrity Provisions of the Standard Instructions, all bidders must provide with their bid, **if applicable**, the declaration form available on the [Forms for the Integrity Regime](http://www.tpsgc-pwgsc.gc.ca/ci-if/declaration-eng.html) website (<http://www.tpsgc-pwgsc.gc.ca/ci-if/declaration-eng.html>), to be given further consideration in the procurement process.

5.1.2 Certifications Precedent to Contract Award and Additional Information

The certifications and additional information listed below should be submitted with the bid, but may be submitted afterwards. If any of these required certifications or additional information is not completed and submitted as requested, the Contracting Authority will inform the Bidder of a time frame within which to provide the information. Failure to provide the certifications or the additional information listed below within the time frame provided will render the bid non-responsive.

5.2.1 Integrity Provisions – Required Documentation

In accordance with the section titled Information to be provided when bidding, contracting or entering into a real procurement agreement of the [Ineligibility and Suspension Policy](http://www.tpsgc-pwgsc.gc.ca/ci-if/politique-policy-eng.html) (<http://www.tpsgc-pwgsc.gc.ca/ci-if/politique-policy-eng.html>), the Bidder must provide the required documentation, as applicable, to be given further consideration in the procurement process.

- a. In accordance with the Integrity Provisions and the *Ineligibility and Suspension Policy*, the following must be provided as part of the solicitation process.
 - i. Bidders, offerors or suppliers that are **corporate entities**, including those bidding as joint ventures, must provide a complete list of names of all current directors or, for a privately owned corporation, the names of the owners of the corporation.

5.2.2 Federal Contractors Program for Employment Equity - Bid Certification

Canada will have the right to declare a bid non-responsive if the Bidder, or any member of the Bidder if the Bidder is a Joint Venture, appears on the "FCP Limited Eligibility to Bid" list at the time of contract award.

Canada will also have the right to terminate the Contract for default if a Contractor, or any member of the Contractor if the Contractor is a Joint Venture, appears on the "[FCP Limited Eligibility to Bid](#)" list during the period of the Contract.

PART 6 - RESULTING CONTRACT CLAUSES

The following clauses and conditions apply to and form part of any contract resulting from the bid solicitation.

6.1 Security Requirements

6.2 Requirement

The Contractor must provide the repair and overhaul services detailed at 'Line Item Detail' in accordance with the Statement of Work at Annex 'A'.

6.2.1 Condition of Material

The Contractor must provide the repaired unit in Overhauled or Serviceable condition.

6.2.2 Airworthiness Documentation

The Contractor shall provide the following airworthiness documentation, enclosed in the shipment or attached to the item: OEM Certificate of Conformance and a copy of the original Authorized Release Certificate (FAA 8130-3) issued by the manufacturer.

6.2.3 Incomplete Assemblies

The Contractor must not ship incomplete assemblies unless the authorization for such shipment has been obtained before from the Contracting Authority.

6.6 Payment

6.6.1 Basis of Payment

In consideration of the Contractor satisfactorily completing all of its obligations under the Contract, the Contractor will be paid a firm unit price, as specified in the Contract. Customs duties and Applicable Taxes are extra.

Canada will not pay the Contractor for any design changes, modifications or interpretations of the Work, unless they have been approved, in writing, by the Contracting Authority before their incorporation into the Work.

6.7 Invoicing Instructions

6.11 Inspection and Acceptance

The Technical Authority is the Inspection Authority. All reports, deliverable items, documents, goods and all services rendered under the Contract are subject to inspection by the Inspection Authority or representative. Should any report, document, good or service not be to the satisfaction of the Inspection Authority, as submitted, the Inspection Authority will have the right to reject it or require its correction at the sole expense of the Contractor before recommending payment.

6.12 Limitation of Contractor's Liability for Damages to Canada

- 1. This section applies despite any other provision of the Contract and replaces the section of the general conditions entitled "Liability". Any reference in this section to damages caused by the Contractor also includes damages caused by its employees, as well as its subcontractors, agents, and representatives, and any of their employees.

2. Whether the claim is based in contract, tort, or another cause of action, the Contractor's liability for all damages suffered by Canada caused by the Contractor's performance of or failure to perform the Contract is limited to Contract Value. This limitation of the Contractor's liability does not apply to:
 - a. any infringement of intellectual property rights; or
 - b. any breach of warranty obligations.
 3. Each Party agrees that it is fully liable for any damages that it causes to any third party in connection with the Contract, regardless of whether the third party makes its claim against Canada or the Contractor. If Canada is required, as a result of joint and several liability, to pay a third party in respect of damages caused by the Contractor, the Contractor must reimburse Canada for that amount.

- e. a copy of the final test results for the certification of the unit.

3.5 Upon completion of repairs/overhaul, the Contractor must ship the units directly to the address specified by the Technical Authority and provide a waybill number for tracking the shipment.

4.0 Deliverables

4.2 Certification Documentation

All certification documentation such as an Authorized Release Certificate provided by the Contractor must meet the requirements set forth in the applicable sections of the Canadian Airworthiness Regulations (CARs) including a TC Form One and FAA 8130-3 as identified at section 2.0 Reference Documents. All parts shipped, new, repaired, overhauled or modified must be covered by an Authorized Release Certificate, signed by an authorized representative of the repair facility and one copy must accompany the invoice, along with a copy of the completed work order and if applicable, the updated component history form.

4.5 Additional Defects or Component is found BER

Where the Contractor finds additional required repair(s) or where the component is deemed BER during the Repair/Overhaul both PSPC and ASD are to be notified and advised of the finding. PSPC will provide direction regarding a way forward.

5.0 Constraints

5.2 Sub-Contracted Work

5.2.1 Any work carried out by a subcontractor and charged to Canada under this contract must have prior approval from the Technical Authority. The Contractor must provide the Technical Authority with

proof that the sub-contractor is authorized to carry out this work and complies with all applicable requirements of this Statement of Work.

5.2.2 All subcontracted work must be documented and meet the requirements of Section 3.2.

5.2.3 Shipping and insurance costs to and from the Sub-contractors facility is the responsibility of the Contractor.

5.3 Language

Any documentation provided to TC ASD as part of the work to be completed must be in English.

6.0 Support Provided by Canada

6.1 Transportation

6.1.1 Transport Canada will provide the Contractor with the Courier and account number for delivery of material and equipment from the Contractor's facility to the Consignee. Transporting vehicle must be Air-ride.

6.1.2 All shipments must be shipped UNINSURED. Any incurred shipping insurance costs will be the Contractor's responsibility.
