## Questions and Answers # 2

### Question 1

We are currently reviewing the recent RFP 202102237-1 "**What works in Indigenous Community Corrections - A Review of Best Practices and Gaps in Service**". The proposal is due July 7th.

The requirements in the current RFP appear to be very similar to those in previous RFP – 201904038-2 *Crime Prevention in Indigenous Communities: Culturally-Relevant Programming and Culturally-Competent Evaluation*. Can you confirm if this is correct, given the contract for the first RFP was awarded?

### Answers 1

The main requirements between the previous RFP and the currently posted RFP are different. The previous RFP (*Crime Prevention in Indigenous Communities: Culturally-Relevant Programming and Culturally-Competent Evaluation*) requires the Contractor to conduct a literature review and provide a comprehensive report on the use of culturally-relevant activities and culturally-competent evaluation for crime prevention programming in the Indigenous context (i.e., mainly primary and secondary crime prevention programs).

However, the primary objectives of the current RFP (*What works in Indigenous Community Corrections - A Review of Best Practices and Gaps in Service*) are to:

- a) provide a comprehensive literature review of **Indigenous community corrections** in Canada (i.e., more focused on tertiary prevention); and,
- b) gather input from community-based service providers and Indigenous offenders who are currently, or who have recently participated in a PS supported Indigenous community reintegration project (i.e., requiring engagement and interviews with stakeholders).
