The RCMP Departmental Representative (Project Manager) is the representative of the department or agency for whom the Work is being carried out under the contract and is responsible for all matters concerning the technical content of the Work under the contract. Changes to the contract can only be made through a contract amendment issued by the Contracting Authority.

SC01 SECURITY RELATED REQUIREMENTS, DOCUMENT SAFEGUARDING

 - a. The Contractor SHALL NOT remove or make copies of any PROTECTED, DESIGNATED or CLASSIFIED information or assets from the identified work site(s), and the Contractor must ensure that its personnel are made aware of and comply with this restriction.
 - b. The Contractor must comply with the provisions of the: Security Requirements Check List (SRCL) attached at Annex C.

SC02 INSURANCE TERMS

1. **Insurance Contracts**

- a. The Contractor must, at the Contractor's expense, obtain and maintain insurance contracts in accordance with the requirements of the Certificate of Insurance. Coverage must be placed with an Insurer licensed to carry out business in Canada.
- b. Compliance with the insurance requirements does not release the Contractor from or reduce its liability under the contract. The Contractor is responsible for deciding if additional insurance coverage is necessary to fulfill its obligation under the contract and to ensure compliance with any applicable law. Any additional insurance coverage is at the Contractor's expense, and for its own benefit and protection.

2. **Period of Insurance**
