# Question #21:

P. 10 of the RFP states that "Bidders should demonstrate their capability and describe their approach in a thorough, concise and clear manner for carrying out the work" and that "The technical bid should address clearly and in sufficient depth the points that are subject to the evaluation criteria against which the bid will be evaluated." However, the mandatory and technical criteria (M1-M3 and R1-R8) do not indicate a score associated with a technical approach. Can you clarify if contractors are expected to provide a methodology/approach, and if so, how it will be evaluated?

#### Answer:

The instructions provided on page 10, Section 3.1 of the RFP do not constitute a mandatory requirement. Bidders must meet the technical mandatory criteria found in Appendix 1

"In their technical bid, Bidders should demonstrate their understanding of the requirements contained in the bid solicitation and explain how they will meet these requirements. Bidders should demonstrate their capability and describe their approach in a thorough, concise and clear manner for carrying out the work."

#### Answer:

The contractor shall be responsible for collecting data. If needed, the Crown will be available to contact utilities to confirm the legitimacy of the contractor's data request.
