Title – Titre : Banff Upper Hot Springs Retaining Wall – Banff National Park

Amendment 001

This amendment is being raised to distribute information from the site visit and make revisions to the tender package.

A. Question and Answers

Q1. What is the plan regarding keeping the facility open during construction?

A1. The intension is to keep the facility open. If for safety reasons we need to close the facility to public for a short period of time, then that could be arranged with enough advance notice given by contractor.

Q2. What times are the facility open to the public?

A2. This could change due to Covid-19, but the plan for fall/winter is currently 10am-6pm daily.

Q3. What access must be maintained?

A3.

- Public/staff access to the pool building must be maintained.
- Access must be given for staff to deliver chemicals via handcart through the delivery hatches directly adjacent to the project area. Normally once every 2 weeks. Parks will stock up as much as possible prior to commencement of the project and will give the contractor advance notice when access will be required.
- Gated staff access via black metal stairs within the project area can be closed for the duration of the project.

Q4. Are there limitations on noise given the close proximity to the pool? A4. It is expected that the project will create noise and will be disruptive to our guests. This is something that we accept.

Q5. Is there any flexibility around the completion date of Nov 30th, 2021?

A5. This date was chosen as the goal was to finish the project before winter sets in, recognizing that winter construction is more complicated and expensive. However, winter construction is a possibility. There is space to heat and hoard. If necessary, the asphalt may have to be put down in the spring. Our fiscal year end is March 31st, 2022, so we are motivated to fully complete the project by that date.

Q6. What is the extent of the asphalt removal?

A6. As per drawings.

Q7. How much material is being excavated?

A7. The wall ranges in height from 6 ft to 8 ft. It is a considerable amount of fill removal.

Q8. What was found during the geotechnical coring that was done on the top side of the wall. A8. Please refer to geotechnical report which forms part of tender package.

Q9. What is Tufa? And how fragile is it?

A9. It is Calcium Carbonate rock that has been historically laid down by minerals contained within the hot springs water. Tufa varies in hardness and is found throughout the site. It is possible that it exists at depth within the project area. Disturbance to Tufa is to be minimized.

Q10. Where can supplies/equipment be staged from?

A10. There is a small amount of room in front of the waterfall. Additional space is located at the back end of the parking lot.

Q11. Does Parks Canada have a designated disposal site to receive/recycle the demolished asphalt and concrete?

A11. No.

Q12. Does Parks Canada have a designated disposal site to receive excavated native material? A12. No, and there is no native material. It is all fill material from when the wall was constructed.
