This amendment is raised to distribute questions and answers and to make changes to the tender package.

A. Bid Closing Date

The closing date for tender 5P468-21-0218/A is extended from March 1, 2022 to March 8, 2022 at 2:00PM Mountain Standard Time (MST).

B. Questions and Answers

Q1 Would PCA be willing to extend the proposed schedule to allow for substantially more time to complete WP1 and WP2 (Literature review and Assessment Framework) as well as WP3 and WP4 (Assessment and Reporting)? If so, how much longer would PCA be willing to extend each Work Package? This is an aggressive schedule and there are many advantages to spending more effort and time up front on these types of projects. Also, extending assessment timing will allow for more appropriate site conditions and a more balanced workload on local PCA staff.

A1 It is critical for the project to meet the August 10 deadline for preliminary asset category review and analysis results (WP5), as indicated in the SOW, in order to align with other work that the Agency is performing concurrently. Furthermore, asset assessments (WP3) must be completed before the summer operating season begins (June 1), unless there is an unforeseen constraint that prevents this. Visitation to the sites increases significantly after May 31, severely limiting the availability of staff to assist with access and information. The proponent may propose adjustments to the schedule for Work Packages 1 and 2, provided that the assessments can be completed by May 31 (WP 3 and 4), and the August 10 deadline for WP5 can be met.

Q2 Can PCA please provide detailed information (building type, size, name, gross floor area, etc.) on the list of assets that are expected to be reviewed by the Consultant? **A2** See attached revised Annex A, Appendix 3.

Q3 In Annex A, Appendix 3, Section 1, The NPFU region total column does not sum the assets correctly and there is a large discrepancy. Can PCA please provide an updated list with the correct totals? **A3** See attached revised Annex A, Appendix 3.
