Amendment 001

The following is hereby amended:

A. Answer questions from Bidders;

A. QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS

Part 1- General information and in Part 6 - Resulting contract clauses. The following questions relate to point 1.2 Security requirements and 6.2 Security requirements:

- Q1 Can you please clarify this sentence: « New personnel security clearance requests require the fingerprinting of individuals to conduct a criminal record check? »
- A1. An error has crept into the French version of the document. Here is the full sentence that we should have read in clause 1.2 in the General Information section: "New applications for personnel security clearances require individuals to be fingerprinted in order to complete a criminal record check."
- Q2. Is it correct to state that: In order to obtain a valid reliability status mentioned in point 6.2, it will be necessary to provide the fingerprints of each employee who did not obtain it the previous year?
- A2. Indeed, all employees must provide their fingerprints in order to obtain a reliability status. Instructions for doing so will be provided by Parks Canada once the Contractor has confirmed the names of all its personnel assigned to this mandate. If employees have already obtained a reliability status in the past, they do not have to redo the process (including fingerprinting) unless their legal situation has changed since the last evaluation of their file.

Part 4- Evaluation procedures and basis of selection.

The following question concerns point 4.1.1.1 Mandatory technical criteria:

- Q3. EXCLUSIVE: In the absence of a maximum budget base set out in document 5P300-21-0336/A, is it possible to have details about the conduct of the selection process? For example, in the event that the total amount of the budget provided by the entrepreneur is not in line with the expectations of the selection committee, how will the rest of the process be envisaged?
- **A3.** Bids will be evaluated under clause 4.1.3.1; highest combined rating for technical merit and price.

Part 6- Resulting contract clauses.

The following question concerns point 6.8.5 Terms of payment:

- **Q4.** As the terms of payment have changed compared to previous contracts, is it possible to have more details on what is expected by the contracting authority?
- **A4.** Terms of payment are currently monthly, but this may be changed following a discussion between the Contractor and Parks Canada once the contract is awarded.

Annex A- Statement of work.

The following question concerns point 3.4.1 Raiding and interpretation service:

Q5. The duration indicated for the St. Lawrence live activity is 60 minutes, corresponding to the duration of the actual activity, not including preparation, installation and storage time at the end of the activity. For Ocean encounters, the duration indicated is 2 hours. What is this duration? Knowing that usually the effective duration of the activity is also about 60 minutes.

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A5. An error unfortunately crept into the statement of work regarding the duration of the "Ocean encounters" activity. The effective duration of the activity, in front of the public, is 60 minutes (1 hour), which does not include preparation steps, installation and storage.

The following question concerns point 3.4.1 Raiding and interpretation service and 3.4.2 Aquarium:

- Q6. The guide-interpreter presenting an introduction and a conclusion to the screening of the film as well as the one presenting the short improvised capsule on the food of the organisms of the aquarium, is he part of the two guide-interpreters providing the interpretation service whose presence is mandatory from 11 a.m. to 5 p.m. each day of opening?
- A6. Yes, the guide-interpreter who presents an introduction and a conclusion to the screening of the film and who presents a short improvised capsule on the feeding of organisms in the aquarium is one of the two guide-interpreters who provides the interpretation service at each opening day, and whose presence is mandatory.
