- 1. Kenton Thiessen provided opening comments on the presentation format.



The Contractor agrees to the application of an IBP Holdback when its IBP obligations are not being achieved. In the event that IBP obligations are not being achieved by the Contractor, Canada may retain a percentage or amount of any progress payment(s), up to 2% of the progress payment value.

The total IBP Holdback may be retained by Canada under circumstances including but not limited to the following:

- Original IBP obligations, or modified IBP obligations approved in advance by Canada have not been delivered by the Contractor; or
- b. Canada determines that sufficient evidence has not been provided by the Contractor demonstrating that IBP commitments could not be delivered due to circumstances outside of the Contractor's control.

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The total amount of portion(s) of any payment(s) subject to IBP Holdback remaining at the end of the Contract related to the Contractor's failure to meet its IBP obligations may be retained by Canada indefinitely.
