IMPORTANT NOTICE TO BIDDERS

TWO PHASE SELECTION PROCESS

This is the first phase (Phase one) of a two-phase competition: the first phase will evaluate the qualifications of all bidders; second phase (Phase two) will invite the qualified bidders to provide a financial bid on the project based on the specifications and drawings. Upon award of contract in Phase Two the pre-qualification list resulting from first phase will expire and will not be used in any other solicitation.

DEBRIEFING:

Should a bidder desire a debriefing, the bidder should contact the person identified on the front page of the solicitation document within 15 working days of the notification of the results of the solicitation. The confidentiality of information relating to other submissions will be protected. The debriefing may be provided in writing, by telephone or in person.

LIST OF PRE-QUALIFIED BIDDERS:

The qualification list will expire within 60 days or upon award of a contract in Phase Two, whichever is earlier, and the prequalification list will not be used in any other solicitation.

INSTRUCTIONS TO BIDDERS

1. TWO PHASE SELECTION PROCESS

Bidders responding to this selection process are requested to submit a bid in two phases. Phase One bid covers only the qualifications and experience of the Bidder. Following the evaluation of the submissions, bidders will be advised of their qualification result and the status of the tender. Phase Two Bidders will be provided an Invitation to Tender (ITT) for the financial evaluation in relation to the specifications and drawings.

Please note that any and all bidders that qualify for Phase Two of the solicitation are subject to the COVID-19 Vaccination Policy for Supplier Personnel and all vendor will be required to submit a completed COVID-19 Vaccination Requirement Certification with their bid submission.

Enquiries are to be made in writing and should be received no less than seven (7) working days prior to the closing date to allow sufficient time to respond.

3. SUBMISSION OF BID

1. Electronic Bid Submission by CPC Connect Service

- a. Bids must be submitted by using the Canada Post Corporation's (CPC) Connect service provided by. Faxed and hard copy bids (submitted in person or via mail/courier) will not be accepted for the subject bid solicitation.
- b. The only acceptable email address to use with CPC Connect for responses to bid solicitations issued by PWGSC is:

Note: Bids emailed directly to this email address will be rejected and deemed non-compliant. This email address is to be used to open a CPC Connect conversation, as detailed in c., or to send proposals through a CPC Connect message if the Bidder is using its own licensing agreement for CPC Connect.

- c. To submit a bid using CPC Connect service, the Bidder must either:
 - i. send directly its bid only to the specified PWGSC Bid Receiving Unit, using its own licensing agreement for CPC Connect; or
 - ii. send as early as possible, and in any case, at least six business days prior to the solicitation closing date and time, (in order to ensure a response), an email that includes the bid solicitation number to the specified PWGSC Bid Receiving Unit requesting to open a CPC Connect conversation. Requests to open a CPC Connect conversation received after that time may not be answered.

- d. If the Bidder sends an email requesting CPC Connect service to the specified Bid Receiving Unit in the bid solicitation, an officer of the Bid Receiving Unit will then initiate a CPC Connect conversation. The CPC Connect conversation will create an email notification from Canada Post Corporation prompting the Bidder to access and action the message within the conversation. The Bidder will then be able to transmit its bid afterward at any time prior to the solicitation closing date and time.
- e. If the Bidder is using its own licensing agreement to send its bid, the Bidder must keep the CPC Connect conversation open until at least thirty (30) business days after the solicitation closing date and time.
- f. The bid solicitation number should be identified in the CPC Connect message field of all electronic transfers.
- g. It should be noted that the use of CPC Connect service requires a Canadian mailing address. Should a bidder not have a Canadian mailing address, they may use the Bid Receiving Unit address specified in the solicitation in order to register for the CPC Connect service.
- h. For bids transmitted by CPC Connect service, Canada will not be responsible for any failure attributable to the transmission or receipt of the bid including, but not limited to, the following:
 - i. receipt of a garbled, corrupted or incomplete bid;
 - ii. availability or condition of the CPC Connect service;
 - iii. incompatibility between the sending and receiving equipment;
 - iv. delay in transmission or receipt of the bid;
 - v. failure of the Bidder to properly identify the bid;
 - vi. illegibility of the bid;
 - vii. security of bid data; or,
 - viii. inability to create an electronic conversation through the CPC Connect service.
- i. The Bid Receiving Unit will send an acknowledgement of the receipt of bid document(s) via the CPC Connect conversation, regardless of whether the conversation was initiated by the supplier using its own license or the Bid Receiving Unit. This acknowledgement will confirm only the receipt of bid document(s) and will not confirm if the attachments may be opened nor if the content is readable.
- j. Bidders must ensure that they are using the correct email address for the Bid Receiving Unit when initiating a conversation in CPC Connect or communicating with the Bid Receiving Unit and should not rely on the accuracy of copying and pasting the email address into the CPC Connect system.
- k. A bid transmitted by CPC Connect service constitutes the formal bid of the Bidder.

PHASE ONE QUALIFICATION FORM

PROJECT DESCRIPTION:

Public Services and Procurement Canada has an upcoming requirement for Multi Year - Full Depth Reclamation & Bituminous Surface Treatment at various locations from Km 571.3 to Km 957.1 on the Alaska Highway, B.C. This will be a 3 year contract.

Work to be performed includes, but is not limited to the following:

1. Pulverizing bituminous surface treatment and base course material.
2. All Full Depth Reclamation Sections will require gravel placement. Amount will be determined by Departmental Representative. No separate payment will be made for gravel placement.
3. Blending, shaping and compacting pulverized material.
4. Applying bituminous surface treatment.
5. No separate payment for hauling aggregates from stockpile.
6. Supply two (2) labourer's to rake center line seam, remove large rocks that make there way through the spreader and other areas as required.
7. Before spraying Emulsified Asphalt, sections may require sweeping as determined by Departmental Representative. No extra payment for pre-sweeping these sections.
8. Sweep complete road surface as often as necessary to remove all loose material completely off road surface over fore slope. If broom can't completely remove loose material over fore slope, supplement with grader. No separate payment for grader if required.
9. If material requires screening, all costs will be incidental to the contract.
10. If pit becomes depleted no extra payment for hauling from the next nearest pit.

All work including clean-up and demobilization must be completed by August 15, 2024.
