Nature of Requirements:

The following is a summary of the statement of work for this requirement.

The Correctional Service Canada (CSC) Health Services require the services of a Speech Language Pathologist (SLP) for the Regional Treatment Center in the Ontario Region. The SLP must provide patient assessment, consultation, and referrals as needed. The target patient population will be geriatric, post-cerebrovascular accident, post-acquired brain injury, patients suffering from progressive neurological disease, and any others who may benefit from SLP consultation. The SLP must collaborate with the interdisciplinary health services team that includes, but is not limited to nursing, psychology, social work, occupational therapy and other allied healthcare professionals.

Objectives: Provide one 7.5hr clinic per month for patients at the Regional Treatment Centre (Ontario) who could benefit from Speech Language Pathologist intervention. This includes but is not limited to geriatric, post-cerebrovascular accident, post-acquired brain injury, and patients suffering from progressive neurological disease. In particular, the Contractor must provide specialized assessment, consultation, referral to other allied health professionals as well as community assessments (e.g) swallowing assessment).

Deliverables:

- a) Assessment of Regional Treatment Centre (Ontario) patients upon referral from allied health professionals;
- b) Formal and informal assessment of communication and swallowing, which may involve evaluation, diagnosis, referral for additional testing and counselling;
- c) Intervention for communication and swallowing disorders, which may involve promotion, prevention, counselling, treatment, consultation, management, (re)habilitation and education;
- d) Measurement of patient or client outcomes for these services;
- e) Development of a plan of care for nursing staff, occupational therapy, or other allied health professionals as needed;
- f) Consultation with and referral to other professionals.
