##### **Summary**

The contractor will analyze and report ultra-trace results for water, sediment and fish tissue samples to ECCC, for samples collected and submitted by ECCC, as and when requested during the period of the contract (2022-23 + option years). To be clear, “tissue” within this document refers to fish tissue specifically. For consistency with data collected to date and comparability with other agencies, analyses for the analyte groups must be done by methods described in the solicitation. **All analytes and limits of detection listed in solicitation must be measured and met, respectively, to ensure consistency and comparability of this study with the broader initiative.**

#### **2. Security**

- a. There are no security requirements associated with this solicitation.

#### **3. Integrity Provisions**

“Bidders must provide a list of names, or other related information as needed, pursuant to section 01 Integrity Provisions of Standard Instructions (2003).

#### **4. Service Requirements**
