## Note: \* Stopping the leak (step 3)

As directed by the Military Police, no vehicle is allowed to be moved at an accident scene in which death or serious injury has occurred, until the investigation has been completed.

Therefore it may not be possible to stop the leak, until authorization to move the vehicle has been obtained.

In this case, containment below the site is the only option.

## WHAT TO DO WHEN A SPILL OCCURS

### Report the spill:

**All spills/releases (air, water, land, inside a building) must be reported regardless of size to:**

**Gagetown Fire Hall** (if in Garrison): local 2106

**Range Control** (if in RTA): local 3121 or 2482, or Freq 49.90-

**Outside of 5 CDSB Gagetown** call the local fire department or nearest support base. (see back page)

## Information Required

The following information is the minimum required when reporting a spill through Range Control or directly to the Fire Hall:

- Name, Rank, Unit
- Contact Number
- Product Spilled/Released
- Quantity Spilled/Released
- Location of Spill/Released
- Cause of Spill/Release
- Special Concerns

### Special concerns include but are not limited to:

- Product migrated into ditches and/or flowing water, ponds, wetlands or sensitive habitat
- Product migrated into floor drain or storm drain
- Spill/release occurred in close proximity to private dwellings and property, public buildings or high traffic areas
- Other chemical reactions are occurring
- You are unable to contain the spill/release
- Injury or personal safety concerns

## Response Steps

### 1. Safety

- Shut down ignition source
- When necessary evacuate to a safe distance
- Consult Emergency Response Guidebook (if available)

### 2. Report the spill

- Fire Hall/Range Control
- Unit representatives

### 3. Stop the leak if possible\* (\*see back page)

### 4. Contain spilled product

- Use vehicle spill kit
- Use available materials such as earth, logs, grass or packed snow

### 5. Clean up contaminated material

### 6. Properly dispose of material

- Seek advice from local base environment or Hazmat / Haz Waste office (see back page for contact information)

### 7. Submit a written report

- The U Env O must submit a written report using the 5 CDSG Environmental Services spill report form
- >0 to <100 L/kg within 48 hours
- > 100 L/kg within 24 hours
- Ref DAOD 2008-3, **Issue and Crisis Management**, a SIR may be required
