IMPORTANT NOTICE TO BIDDERS

TWO STAGE SELECTION PROCESS

This is the first stage (Stage one) of a two-stage competition: the first stage will evaluate the qualifications of all bidders; second stage (Stage two) will invite the qualified bidders to provide further qualifications and a financial bid on the project based on the specifications and drawings. Upon award of contract in Stage Two the prequalification list will expire and will not be used in any other solicitation. The qualification list will expire within 180 days or upon award of a contract in Stage Two, whichever is earlier, and the prequalification list will not be used in any other solicitation.

LIST OF PRE-QUALIFIED BIDDERS:

A list of pre-qualified bidders from Stage One will not be released. Contract award notice of the successful bidder of Stage Two will be posted on canadabuys.canada.ca

BIDS RECEIVED BY FAX AND EMAIL WILL BE ACCEPTED AS OFFICIAL.

BIDS RECEIVED IN-PERSON OR BY COURIER WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED.

The only acceptable email address for responses to bid solicitations is soumissionsami-bidsrpc@pc.gc.ca. Bids submitted by email directly to the Contracting Authority or to any email address other than soumissionsami-bidsrpc@pc.gc.ca will not be accepted.

The maximum email file size that Parks Canada is capable of receiving is 15 megabytes. The Bidder is responsible for any failure attributable to the transmission or receipt of the emailed bid due to file size.

The Bidder should be cognisant of the size of the email as a whole, and not only the attachments. Please take into consideration that some attachments, when sent, may be resized during the email transfer. If the email size is too large, the Bidder should send the bid in multiple emails properly labeled with the solicitation number, project name, and indicate how many emails are included (ex. 1 of 2).

Emails with links to bid documents will not be accepted. Bid documents must be sent as email attachments.

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SPECIAL INSTRUCTIONS TO BIDDERS (SI)

TWO-STAGE SELECTION PROCESS

This is a two-stage selection process. Bidders responding to this selection process are requested to submit a bid in two stages. Stage One bid covers only the qualifications and experience of the Bidder.

Following the evaluation of the submissions, Bidders will be advised of their qualification result and the status of the tender. Stage Two Bidders will be provided an INVITATION TO TENDER (ITT) for further qualification and the financial evaluation in relation to the specifications and drawings. Please refer to sample ITT attached (Appendix 2). Please note that the ITT used in Stage 2 of this process will be a Two-Envelope ITT with both a technical evaluation component and price evaluation component. The attached sample is only being provided for bidders to reference the General Conditions.

ENQUIRIES DURING THE SOLICITATION PERIOD

- 1. Enquiries regarding this bid must be submitted in writing to the Contracting Officer named on the Invitation to Tender Page 1 at e-mail address sheldon.lalonde@pc.gc.ca. Enquiries should be received no later than five (5) business days prior to the date set for solicitation closing to allow sufficient time to provide a response. Enquiries received after that time may result in an answer NOT being provided.
- 2. To ensure consistency and quality of the information provided to Bidders, PCA will examine the content of the enquiry and will decide whether or not to issue an amendment.
- 3. All enquiries and other communications related to this bid sent throughout the solicitation period must be directed ONLY to the Contracting Authority named in paragraph 1. above. Failure to comply with this requirement may result in the bid being declared non- compliant.

STAGE 1

Appendix 1 – Stage One Qualification Requirements must be submitted **ONLY** to the PCA Bid Receiving Unit by the date, time and place indicated on page 1 of the Invitation to Qualify. The PCA will not assume responsibility for submissions directed to any other location.

Submissions received by fax and email will be accepted as official and must meet the following requirements:

- a. Must satisfy Appendix 1 Stage One Qualification Requirements and should include the completed front page of the Request for Qualifications.
- b. Must indicate:
 - Solicitation number
 - Name of Bidder

The first page of all amendment(s) that have been duly signed/initialed verifying proof of receipt or written acknowledgement of receipt of amendments should be submitted with the bid but may be submitted afterwards. If any amendment(s) are not acknowledged as requested, the Contracting Authority will inform the Bidder of a time frame within which to provide the information. Failure to provide the documentation within the time frame specified will render the bid non-responsive.

COMPLETION OF SUBMISSION

The Bidder shall base the submission on the applicable documents listed in the Special Instructions to Bidders. It is the responsibility of the Bidder to obtain clarification on any terms, conditions or technical requirements contained in this document.

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DEBRIEFINGS

After contract award, bidders may request a debriefing on the results of the bid solicitation process. Bidders should make the request to the Contracting Authority within fifteen (15) working days of receipt of the results of the bid solicitation process. The debriefing may be in writing or by telephone.

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APPENDIX 1 – PHASE ONE QUALIFICATION FORM

DESCRIPTION:

Parks Canada requires the furnishing of all labour, materials and equipment required to construct a new green micro-grid power generation system at Sable Island National Park Reserve (SINPR) to generate electricity. The system combines zero-carbon sources (21.8 kW Solar PV) with more efficient, lower carbon, generation technology (2 x 45 kW variable speed gensets) in an advanced micro-grid with a battery energy storage system (190 kWh capacity). The project goal is to reduce GHG emissions by 50% from current levels. This is conjunction with energy efficient building retrofits (heat pumps and lighting controls) to reduce the electrical demand.

Sable Island National Park Reserve is located offshore in the Atlantic Ocean, 190 km from the nearest landfall in Nova Scotia. Due to its remoteness, the island's operations depend on transportation of all people and cargo to the island by either air or sea and the construction period is constrained by the sealift schedule and bird nesting.

The following is a highlight of some of the scope:

- 1. Removal of two existing fixed speed diesel electric generators from the Garage Building.
- 2. Installation of two new parallel capable, variable speed, diesel electric generators c/w heat recovery system in the Garage Building.
- 3. Installation of a new DC coupled solar photovoltaic array and containerized energy storage system.
- 4. Installation of a new microgrid controller to manage the output of the energy storage system and two new generators to meet the electrical demand of the island.
- 5. Installation of occupancy sensor-based lighting controls in the Garage, Carpentry Workshop, Food Stores, and Water Treatment Buildings.
- 6. Installation of new heating systems in the Garage, Carpentry Workshop, and Food Stores Buildings.
- Replacement of electrical distribution equipment throughout Main Station at SINPR.

Work is to be completed by November 30, 2025.

BIDDER INSTRUCTIONS:

The Bidder is requested to respond to the Phase One Evaluation Criteria using the tables below.

BASIS OF SELECTION:

A submission must comply with the mandatory requirements to be declared responsive in Stage One.

MANDATORY REQUIREMENTS:

At Stage One bid closing time, the Bidder must:

- a) comply with the following Mandatory Requirements; and
- b) provide the necessary documentation to support compliance.

All Mandatory requirements should be completed and submitted prior to closing with sufficient detail to demonstrate compliance. Failure to demonstrate compliance with all mandatory requirements via the original submission, may result in the submission being deemed non-responsive. At any time in the evaluation stage should PCA officials identify any minor irregularities or omissions the Contract Authority may inform the proponent of a time frame within which to provide a clarification or missing information. Failure to comply with the request of the Contracting Authority within the time frame provided will render the submission non-responsive.
