

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PART 1 - GENERAL INFORMATION

1.1 Introduction

The bid solicitation is divided into seven parts plus attachments and annexes, as follows:

- Part 1 General Information: provides a general description of the requirement;
- Part 2 Bidder Instructions: provides the instructions, clauses and conditions applicable to the bid solicitation:
- Part 3 Bid Preparation Instructions: provides Bidders with instructions on how to prepare their bid;
- Part 4 Evaluation Procedures and Basis of Selection: indicates how the evaluation will be conducted, the evaluation criteria that must be addressed in the bid, and the basis of selection;
- Part 5 Certifications and Additional Information: includes the certifications and additional information to be provided;
- Part 6 Security, Financial and Other Requirements: includes specific requirements that must be addressed by Bidders; and
- Part 7 Resulting Contract Clauses: includes the clauses and conditions that will apply to any resulting contract.

1.2 Summary

1.2.1 Innovation, Science and Economic Development, Communications Research Centre at 3701 Carling Ave, Ottawa ON requires a Contractor to provide Crowdsourced Wireless Data Services.

This bid solicitation is to establish a service contract for the delivery of the requirement detailed in the bid.

The period of any resulting Contract shall be for a period of one (1) year with two (2) option years. The estimated commencement date is February 1, 2024.

- 1.2.2 There are no security requirements associated with this requirement.
- 1.2.3 Bidders must refer to Part 2 entitled Bidder Instructions, and Part 3 entitled Bid Preparation Instructions, of the bid solicitation, for further information.

1.3 Debriefings

Bidders may request a debriefing on the results of the bid solicitation process. Bidders should make the request to the Contracting Authority within 15 working days from receipt of the results of the bid solicitation process. The debriefing may be in writing, by telephone or in person.

2.1 Standard Instructions, Clauses and Conditions

All instructions, clauses and conditions identified in the bid solicitation by number, date and title are set out in the <u>Standard Acquisition Clauses and Conditions Manual</u> (https://buyandsell.gc.ca/policy-and-guidelines/standard-acquisition-clauses-and-conditions-manual) issued by Public Works and Government Services Canada.

As this solicitation is issued by Innovation, Science and Economic Development (ISED), any reference to Public Works and Government Services Canada or PWGSC or its Minister contained in any term, condition or clause of this solicitation, including any individual SACC clauses incorporated by reference, will be interpreted as reference to ISED or its Minister.

Bidders who submit a bid agree to be bound by the instructions, clauses and conditions of the bid solicitation and accept the clauses and conditions of the resulting contract.

The <u>2003</u> (2023-06-08) Standard Instructions - Goods or Services - Competitive Requirements, are incorporated by reference into and form part of the bid solicitation.

2.2 Submission of Bids

Bids must be submitted only to ISED CRC Bid Receiving Unit by the date, time and place indicated on page 1 of the bid solicitation.

The Innovation, Science and Economic Development (ISED) will not assume responsibility for bids and/or amendments directed to any other location.

All submitted proposals become the property of Canada and will not be returned to the originator.

2.3 Former Public Servant

2.4 Enquiries - Bid Solicitation

All enquiries must be submitted in writing to the Contracting Authority no later than 10 calendar days before the bid closing date. Enquiries received after that time may not be answered.

Bidders should reference as accurately as possible the numbered item of the bid solicitation to which the enquiry relates. Care should be taken by Bidders to explain each question in sufficient detail in order to enable Canada to provide an accurate answer. Technical enquiries that are of a proprietary nature must be clearly marked "proprietary" at each relevant item. Items identified as "proprietary" will be treated as

such except where Canada determines that the enquiry is not of a proprietary nature. Canada may edit the question(s) or may request that the Bidder do so, so that the proprietary nature of the question(s) is eliminated, and the enquiry can be answered to all Bidders. Enquiries not submitted in a form that can be distributed to all Bidders may not be answered by Canada.

2.5 Applicable Laws

Any resulting contract must be interpreted and governed, and the relations between the parties determined, by the laws in force in Ontario.

Bidders may, at their discretion, substitute the applicable laws of a Canadian province or territory of their choice without affecting the validity of their bid, by deleting the name of the Canadian province or territory specified and inserting the name of the Canadian province or territory of their choice. If no change is made, it acknowledges that the applicable laws specified are acceptable to the Bidders.

2.6 Improvement of Requirement During Solicitation Period

Should bidders consider that the specifications or Statement of Work contained in the bid solicitation could be improved technically or technologically, bidders are invited to make suggestions, in writing, to the Contracting Authority named in the bid solicitation. Bidders must clearly outline the suggested improvement as well as the reason for the suggestion. Suggestions that do not restrict the level of competition nor favour a particular bidder will be given consideration provided they are submitted to the Contracting Authority at least 10 days before the bid closing date. Canada will have the right to accept or reject any or all suggestions.

2.7 Basis for Canada's Ownership of Intellectual Property

4006 07 (2008-05-12) License to Intellectual Property Rights to Canada's Information

- Any information supplied by Canada to the Contractor for the performance of the Work remains the property of Canada. The Contractor must use Canada's Information only to perform the Contract.
- 2. If the Contractor wants to use any information owned by Canada for the commercial exploitation or further development of the Foreground Information, the Contractor must obtain a license from the department or agency for which the Contract is performed. In its request for a license to that department or agency, the Contractor must explain why the license is required and how the Contractor intends to use the information. If the department or agency agrees to grant a license, conditions will be negotiated between the Contractor and that department or agency and may include the payment of a compensation to Canada.

Through this contract, the contractor grants ISED a sole Intellectual Property licence giving ISED the right in perpetuity to use, store and transform the data, sometimes via the help of contractors and collaborators. ISED may not share the original data with any 3rd parties (such as external collaborators) without prior authorization from the vendor.

2.8 Bid Challenge and Recourse Mechanisms

- (a) Several mechanisms are available to potential suppliers to challenge aspects of the procurement process up to and including contract award.
- (b) Canada encourages suppliers to first bring their concerns to the attention of the Contracting Authority. Canada's <u>Buy and Sell</u> website, under the heading "<u>Bid Challenge and Recourse Mechanisms</u>" contains information on potential complaint bodies such as:


3.1.2 Electronic Payment of Invoices

Monthly invoices will be submitted for payment based on value of work done contingent upon Innovation, Science and Economic Development Canada's satisfaction with the Work subject to the Project Authority's approval.

Insufficient Funding:

In the event that the lowest compliant bid exceeds the amount of funding allocated to the Work, Innovation, Science and Economic Development Canada in its sole discretion may:

- a. cancel the solicitation; or
- b. obtain additional funding and award the Contract to the Bidder submitting the lowest compliant bid; and/or



c. Negotiate a reduction in the bid price and/or scope of work of not more than 25% with the Bidder submitting the lowest compliant bid. Should an agreement satisfactory to Innovation, Science and Economic Development Canada not be reached, Innovation, Science and Economic Development Canada shall exercise option (a) or (b).

PART 4 - EVALUATION PROCEDURES AND BASIS OF SELECTION

4.1 Evaluation Procedures

4.1.1 Technical Evaluation

4.1.2 Proposal

It is essential that the elements contained in the Proposal(s) be stated in a clear manner and in sufficient depth to allow for evaluation by the evaluation team.

This section comprises the detailed Proposal requirements that will be used to evaluate the Bidder's responses to the Request for Proposal (RFP).

An evaluation team composed of representatives of Canada will evaluate the bids.

4.1.3 Mandatory Criteria

Mandatory Technical Criteria

Each bid will be reviewed to determine whether it meets the mandatory requirements of the bid solicitation. Any element of the bid solicitation that is identified specifically with the words "must" or "mandatory" is a mandatory requirement. Bids that do not comply with each mandatory requirement will be considered non-compliant.

Point-Rated Technical Criteria:

Each bid will be rated by assigning a score to the rated requirements, which are identified in the bid solicitation by the word "rated" or by reference to a score. Bidders who fail to submit complete bids with all the information requested by this bid solicitation will be rated accordingly. The rated requirements are described in Annex "(C)" - Evaluation Criteria

4.1.5 Financial Evaluation

4.1.6 Mandatory Financial Criteria

SACC Manual Clause A0220T (2014-06-26), Evaluation of Price-Bid

The price of the bid will be evaluated in Canadian dollars, Applicable Taxes excluded, FOB destination, Canadian customs duties and excise taxes included.

Complete and submit the Financial Submission Form attached hereto as Annex B. It must be submitted as a separate attachment than the Technical Proposal. **Please note: the US Data option are not part of the financial evaluation.

4.2 Basis of Selection

The contractor selection method will be determined on the basis of the following steps:

Basis of Selection - Highest Combined Rating of Technical Merit 60% and Price 40% (excluding US data pricing option).

- Only those contractors who meet all of the Mandatory Requirements and who achieve (or exceed) the stated minimum points in the Rated Requirements Evaluation will be deemed compliant and will be considered to proceed with the opening of the Financial Submission.
- To arrive at an overall Total Score achieved by a compliant contractor, a weighting has been established whereby technical merit will be valued at 60% and price will be valued at 40%. (excluding the option US data pricing)
- The calculation used to determine the contractor's Total Score will be:

Formula:

In this formula, the Contractor's Technical Score is the number of points achieved (maximum 60) in the assessment of the point-rated requirements while the Contractor's Financial Score is based on the number of points (maximum 40) in the assessment of the per diem rate.

Bidder A	60	(\$300,000.00 / \$400,000.00) x 40 = 30	90
Bidder B	55	(\$300,000.00 / \$300,000.00) x 40 = 40	95
Bidder C	57	(\$300,000.00 / \$350,000.00 x 40 = 34.29	91.29

In this example, **Bidder B** would be recommended for contract award.

In the event that two or more bidders have an identical total of the technical and financial score, the selection will be made by following the steps in the order as they appear below. If all bidders are equivalent on number 1, proceed to number 2, and so forth until a winner is chosen.

Examples:

- 1. The Bidder who has been registered in the province of Ontario and has been in operation for more than three (3) years from the date of issue of this RFP.
- 2. Draw names from a hat or a simple coin toss (Any one of these methods must be used in the presence of the concerned bidders and the mutually agreed solution should involve legal advice).

Contractors will not be reimbursed for the cost of responding to this Request for Proposal

Note: Innovation, Science and Economic Development Canada may choose to terminate the evaluation of any tender upon the first finding of non-compliance with a mandatory requirement.

Innovation, Science and Economic Development Canada reserves the right at its sole discretion to request certification, proof, references, substantiation, or any other information to support and validate the criteria enumerated below. Should the certification, proof, references, substantiation and/or any other information be found unacceptable for any reason as solely determined by Innovation, Science and Economic Development Canada, no further consideration shall be given, and the Bidder will be declared non-compliant.

Requests for Clarifications: If Canada seeks clarification or verification from the Bidder about its bid, the Bidder will have two working days (or a longer period if specified in writing by the Contracting Authority) to provide the necessary information to Canada. Failure to meet this deadline will result in the bid being declared non-responsive.

Requests for Further Information: If Canada requires additional information in order to do any of the following pursuant to the Section entitled "Conduct of Evaluation" in 2003 (2023-06-08), Standard Instructions - Goods or Services - Competitive Requirements:

- 1. Seek clarification or verification from bidders regarding any or all information provided by them with respect to the bid solicitation.
- 2. Request, before award of any contract, specific information with respect to bidders' legal status.
- 3. Conduct a survey of bidders' facilities and/or examine their technical, managerial, and financial capabilities to determine if they are adequate to meet the requirements of the bid solicitation.
- 4. Correct any error in the extended pricing of bids by using unit pricing and any error in quantities in bids to reflect the quantities stated in the bid solicitation; in the case of error in the extension of prices, the unit price will govern.
- 5. Verify any information provided by bidders through independent research, use of any government resources or by contacting third parties.
- 6. Interview, at the sole costs of bidders, any bidder and/or any or all of the resources proposed by bidders to fulfill the requirement of the bid solicitation.

The Bidder must provide the information requested by Canada within two working days of a request by the Contracting Authority.

Failure of a Proposal to provide information in sufficient detail and depth to permit evaluation against the identified criteria may render a Proposal non-responsive.

The Bidder acknowledges and agrees that Canada is not responsible to search for, and therefore evaluate, information that is not properly referenced or is not otherwise provided in accordance with the Proposal.

The Bidder shall not place any conditions or make any assumptions that attempt to limit or otherwise modify the scope of Work pursuant to the Statement of Work (Annex A).

Specific Bidder Instructions:

- Cutting and pasting wording from the RFP into the example/project descriptions of the technical
 proposal does not constitute demonstrating the requirement. This must be demonstrated by
 specific examples of work performed by the proposed resource.
- ISED reserves the right to verify any information provided by the Bidder in response to the

 ISED will use the sample solely for the purpose of bid compliance verification and will discard it
 afterwards.

- 2. To enable departments and agencies to comply with this requirement, the Contractor must provide Canada, upon request, its business number, as applicable. (These requests may take the form of a general call-letter to contractors, in writing or by telephone

If the audit demonstrates that the certification is in error before payment is made, the Contractor agrees that any pending invoice will be adjusted by Canada in accordance with the results of the audit. It is further agreed that if the Contract is still in effect at the time of the verification, the price or rate will be lowered in accordance with the results of the audit.

7.9 Invoicing Instructions

7.10.1 Compliance

Unless specified otherwise, the continuous compliance with the certifications provided by the Contractor in its bid or precedent to contract award, and the ongoing cooperation in providing additional information are conditions of the Contract and failure to comply will constitute the Contractor in default. Certifications are subject to verification by Canada during the entire period of the Contract.

STATEMENT OF WORK

1. Title

Crowdsourced Wireless Data

2. Background

Innovation, Science and Economic Development (ISED) works with Canadians in all areas of the economy and in all parts of the country to improve conditions for investment, enhance Canada's innovation performance, increase Canada's share of global trade, and build a fair, efficient, and competitive marketplace.

This includes managing Canada's airwaves and overseeing its bankruptcy, incorporation, intellectual property, and measurement systems; providing financing and industry research tools to help businesses develop, import, and export; encouraging scientific research; and protecting and promoting the interests of Canadian consumers.

To deliver on its mandate, ISED builds information technology platforms and applications for spectrum data management and analysis, some of which are hosted on-premises while others are cloud-based. These platforms and applications provide users the ability to conduct custom data processing, analysis, and visualization for various data types. ISED's objective with this RFP is to make available the crowdsourced wireless data so that it can be ingested, processed, analyzed, and visualized by ISED systems in an automated fashion.

Furthermore, through its wireless R&D laboratory, the Communications Research Centre (CRC), ISED conducts research and development focused on improving the approaches and methods to manage the wireless spectrum. Related to this procurement, the specific objective is to continue and expand ongoing analysis of real-world quality of service for Telecommunication Services, to gain a better understanding of broadband availability and of wireless spectrum usage, and to use resulting insights to improve spectrum management frameworks.

3. Objective

ISED is expanding its data collection initiatives on the state of Wireless services in Canada, by capturing network performance metrics reported by wireless smartphone devices.

By collecting large scale crowdsourced wireless data, ISED seeks to improve its ability to monitor the performance and availability of Telecommunications Services across Canada, and generate data-driven evidence in support of the development of regulations and policies related to radio spectrum and broadband programs.

4. Scope Of Work

ISED is interested in purchasing crowdsourced wireless data, collected across Canada, consisting of geolocated measurements of wireless network access metrics via mobile networks and WiFi networks, thus directly or indirectly including connections of all types, including mobile, fixed wireline and wireless broadband, satellite, etc. Optionally, ISED is also interested in purchasing similar data for the United States of America (USA).

4.1 General requirements

- 4.1.1. The provided data, either from Canada or optionally from the USA, must include data across all wireless Internet access technologies, such as, Wi-Fi, mobile cellular (2G, 3G, 4G, 5G), satellite. The data shall be collected and reported from all geographic areas of Canada. The optional data from the USA may be limited to one single USA state, including all its metro, urban and rural areas, and limited to the following list of states: New York, California, Illinois, Texas
- 4.1.2. Data must be collected free of charge to users (there may be some costs charged by the service provider strictly due to data usage, not for the test itself).
- 4.1.3. Data must be collected automatically without requiring user intervention (i.e. tests should not have been solicited by the end-users).
- 4.1.4. No personal user information shall be included in the data set(s). The data collection, storage and processing must comply with the Canadian Privacy Act. ISED shall not allow the fusing or correlation of the crowdsourced data acquired through this procurement with any other data set for the purposes of revealing or identifying any personal user information.
- 4.1.5. The data must be curated (cleaned, free of redundancies or errored data points).
- 4.1.6. The contractor shall provide background information and documentation regarding the data collection methodology, the data storage platform, and any other insights to ensure ISED can maximize the use of the data
- 4.1.7. The following information must be included for every data record:
- a. Geolocation (latitude, longitude, altitude)
- b. Timeliness (e.g., measurement date and time)
- c. Internet access technology used (cable, fiber, Wi-Fi, mobile cellular (2G, 3G, 4G, 5G), satellite)
- d. Internet performance metrics, as applicable (e.g., upload and download speed and latency, as detailed in the following section on deliverables, QoS metrics)
- e. For radio technologies, access point ID (e.g., 3GPP global cell ID, such as 3G CGI, 4G ECGI, 5G NCGI), Radio Frequency and Signal Strength (e.g., RSSI for Wi-Fi, RSRP for 4G/LTE, etc.) for the active connection used for the Internet Speed Test (e.g., serving cellular tower), as well as passive RF measurements (e.g., serving and, as available, neighboring cellular towers).
- f. Mobile Network Operator or ISP
- g. Information on reporting device such as manufacturer and model

For a detailed list of the parameters required, refer to Annex D.

4.2 Technical requirements

4.2.1 Data granularity

The latitude and longitude coordinates of the measurements shall be reported in degrees with a minimum of 5 decimal points precision. Only in areas with a very low density of measurements, and limited to less than 5% relative to the total number of measurements, a lower geographic precision may be acceptable to protect user privacy. The contractor shall provide a detailed justification and description of their obfuscation criteria in such cases.

The altitude of the measurements shall be reported in meters with a precision of 1m or better.

The measurement date and time shall be reported with a granularity of 1 hour or better.

4.2.2 Number of measurements

The crowdsourced Canada wireless data must meet the following average monthly requirements (averaged over the past 12 months):

- a. The contractor must provide crowdsourced wireless data from at least 100,000 unique reporting crowdsourced wireless data-collecting smartphones per month.
- The contractor must provide at least 30 million "Category A" samples per month of crowdsourced b. wireless data from the crowdsourced wireless-collecting smartphones. Of these samples, at least 10 million must have valid RSRP and RSRQ field values.
- The contractor must provide at least 400 thousand "Category B" samples per month of C. crowdsourced wireless data from the crowdsourced wireless data-collecting smartphones.
- d. The data provided by the contractor via the crowdsourced wireless data-collecting smartphones must include, at a minimum, the data included in the mandatory data fields listed in Annex D

The crowdsourced USA wireless data must meet the following average monthly requirements (averaged over the past 12 months):

- a. The contractor must provide crowdsourced wireless data from at least 1 million unique reporting crowdsourced wireless data-collecting smartphones per month.
- The contractor must provide at least 1 billion "Category A" samples per month of crowdsourced b. wireless data from the crowdsourced wireless data-collecting smartphones. Of these samples, at least 500 million must have valid RSRP and RSRQ field values.
- The contractor must provide at least 1 million "Category B" samples per month of crowdsourced C. wireless data from the crowdsourced wireless data-collecting smartphones.
- d. The data provided by the contractor via the crowdsourced wireless data-collecting smartphones must include, at a minimum, the data included in the mandatory data fields listed in Annex D

If the contractor is providing USA data for a single state only, the minimum number of measurements required shall be a fraction of those stated above for the USA data. The fraction in such case is determined by the ratio of the state's population over the entire USA population.

Example: if data is being provided for California with a population of 39,538,223 (based on census of 2020), with the USA population of 331,449,281, the minimum number of unique reporting smartphones required for California dataset would be:

39,538,223 / 331,449,281 x 1 million = 119288 (rounded down to nearest integer)

"Category A" samples must contain, at a minimum, all data fields contained in tables 1.1, 1.2, 1.3 and 1.4 in Annex D.

"Category B" samples must contain, at a minimum, all data fields contained in tables 1.1, 1.2, 1.3, 1.4 and 1.5 in Annex D.



5. Deliverables And Associated Schedule

5.1 Crowdsourced wireless data

The contractor shall provide to ISED crowdsourced wireless data collected across Canada, with the parameters described in Section 4.

The period of time for the crowdsourced test data collection and delivery shall be as follows:

- Canada Data: Start: February 1, 2024; End: January 31, 2025 Historical Year Canada Data: Start February 1, 2023; End January 31, 2024
- Option Year 1: Start Canada Data: February 1, 2025; End January 31, 2026
- Option Year 2: Start Canada Data: February 1, 2026; End January 31, 2027
- Option Historical Year US Data: Start February 1, 2023; End January 31, 2024
- Option US data: Start: February 1, 2024; End: January 31, 2025

The above crowdsourced measurement data shall be delivered to ISED in the form of datasets accessible via the Internet. The crowdsourced data shall be made available to ISED via electronic transfer no more than twenty business days from the date of collection. The historical crowdsourced data shall be made available no more than twenty business days from the start of the contract.

The proposal must clarify how the measurement data will be structured, possibly in multiple datasets following different table formats. The description should include information about the expected volume and size of each dataset, their structure and, as applicable, linkage across them.



2. Samples and Categories

"Cases where the field is clearly not applicable" are samples in which the type of connection is incompatible with the data field (e.g. an LTE connection does not have a corresponding Wi-Fi frequency).

ANNEX "E"

FORMER PUBLIC SERVANT

Contracts with former public servants (FPS) in receipt of a pension or of a lump sum payment must bear the closest public scrutiny and reflect fairness in the spending of public funds. In order to comply with Treasury Board policies and directives on contracts with FPS, bidders must provide the information required below.

Act (PSSA), R.S., 1985, c. P-36, and any increases paid pursuant to the <u>Supplementary Retirement</u>

Benefits Act, R.S., 1985, c. S-24 as it affects the PSSA. It does not include pensions payable pursuant to the <u>Canadian Forces Superannuation Act</u>, R.S., 1985, c. C-17, the <u>Defence Services Pension</u>

Continuation Act, 1970, c. D-3, the <u>Royal Canadian Mounted Police Pension Continuation Act</u>, 1970, c. R-10, and the <u>Royal Canadian Mounted Police Superannuation Act</u>, R.S., 1985, c. R-11, the <u>Members of Parliament Retiring Allowances Act</u>, R.S. 1985, c. M-5, and that portion of pension payable to the Canada Pension Plan Act, R.S., 1985, c. C-8.
