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## **PART 1 – INFORMATION AND INSTRUCTIONS**

### **1.1. Security Requirements**

1.1.1. There is no security requirement associated with the bid solicitation.

### **1.2. Statement of Work**

The Work to be performed is detailed under **Article 6.2** of the resulting contract clauses.

### **1.3. Optional Site Visit**

It is recommended that the Bidder or a representative of the Bidder visit the work site. Arrangements have been made for the site visit to be held at **Bar U Ranch National Historic Site, Box 168, Longview AB T0L 1H0** on **February 15, 2024**. The site visit will begin at **11:00 MST**.

Bidders are requested to communicate with the Contracting Authority no later than **February 14, 2024** at **14:00 MST** to confirm attendance and provide the name(s) of the person(s) who will attend. Bidders may be requested to sign an attendance sheet. Bidders who do not attend or do not send a representative will not be given an alternative appointment but they will not be precluded from submitting a bid. Any clarifications or changes to the bid solicitation resulting from the site visit will be included as an amendment to the bid solicitation.

### **1.4. Debriefings**

Bidders may request a debriefing on the results of the bid solicitation process. Bidders should make the request to the Contracting Authority within 15 working days from receipt of the results of the bid solicitation process. The debriefing may be in writing, by telephone or in person.

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## **PART 2 – BIDDER INSTRUCTIONS**

### **2.1. Standard Instructions, Clauses and Conditions**

All instructions, clauses and conditions identified in the bid solicitation by number, date and title are set out in the [Standard Acquisition Clauses and Conditions Manual](https://buyandsell.gc.ca/policy-and-guidelines/standard-acquisition-clauses-and-conditions-manual) (<https://buyandsell.gc.ca/policy-and-guidelines/standard-acquisition-clauses-and-conditions-manual>) issued by Public Works and Government Services Canada.

Bidders who submit a bid agree to be bound by the instructions, clauses and conditions of the bid solicitation and accept the clauses and conditions of the resulting contract.

The [2003](#) (2023-06-08), Standard Instructions – Goods or Services – Competitive Requirements, are incorporated by reference into and form part of the bid solicitation.

All reference to the Department of Public Works and Government Services Canada shall be deleted and replaced with the Parks Canada Agency.

### **2.2. Submission of Bids**

Bids must be submitted only to the Parks Canada Agency (PCA) Bid Receiving Unit by the date and time indicated on page 1 of the bid solicitation.

**Bids submitted in-person or by courier will not be accepted.**

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Emails with links to bid documents will not be accepted. Bid documents must be sent as email attachments.

### **2.3. Enquiries – Bid Solicitation**

All enquiries must be submitted in writing to the Contracting Authority no later than seven (7) calendar days before the bid closing date. Enquiries received after that time may not be answered.

Bidders should reference as accurately as possible the numbered item of the bid solicitation to which the enquiry relates. Care should be taken by Bidders to explain each question in sufficient detail in order to

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enable Canada to provide an accurate answer. Technical enquiries that are of a proprietary nature must be clearly marked "proprietary" at each relevant item. Items identified as "proprietary" will be treated as such except where Canada determines that the enquiry is not of a proprietary nature. Canada may edit the question(s) or may request that the Bidder do so, so that the proprietary nature of the question(s) is eliminated, and the enquiry can be answered to all Bidders. Enquiries not submitted in a form that can be distributed to all Bidders may not be answered by Canada.

#### **2.4. Applicable Laws**

Any resulting contract must be interpreted and governed, and the relations between the parties determined, by the laws in force in Alberta.

The Bidder may, at its discretion, substitute the applicable laws of a Canadian province or territory of its choice without affecting the validity of its bid, by deleting the name of the Canadian province or territory specified and inserting the name of the Canadian province or territory of its choice. If no change is made, it acknowledges that the applicable laws specified are acceptable to the Bidder.

#### **2.5. Bid Challenge and Recourse Mechanisms**

**2.5.1.** Several mechanisms are available to potential suppliers to challenge aspects of the procurement process up to and including contract award.

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## **PART 4 – EVALUATION PROCEDURES AND BASIS OF SELECTION**

### **4.1. Evaluation Procedures**

- (a) Bids will be assessed in accordance with the entire requirement of the bid solicitation including the technical and financial evaluation criteria.
- (b) An evaluation team composed of representatives of Canada will evaluate the bids.

#### **4.1.1. Financial Evaluation**

#### **4.1.2. Basis of Selection**

A bid must comply with all requirements of the bid solicitation to be declared responsive. The responsive bid with the lowest evaluated price will be recommended for award of a contract.



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## **PART 5 – CERTIFICATIONS AND ADDITIONAL INFORMATION**

Bidders must provide the required certifications and additional information to be awarded a contract.

The certifications provided by Bidders to Canada are subject to verification by Canada at all times. Unless specified otherwise, Canada will declare a bid non-responsive, or will declare a contractor in default if any certification made by the Bidder is found to be untrue whether made knowingly or unknowingly, during the bid evaluation period or during the contract period.

The Contracting Authority will have the right to ask for additional information to verify the Bidder's certifications. Failure to comply and to cooperate with any request or requirement imposed by the Contracting Authority will render the bid non-responsive or constitute a default under the Contract.

### **5.1. Certifications Required with the Bid**

Bidders must submit the following duly completed certifications as part of their bid.

#### **5.1.1. Integrity Provisions – Declaration of Convicted Offences**

### **5.2. Certifications Precedent to Contract Award and Additional Information**

If any of these required certifications or additional information is not completed and submitted as requested, the Contracting Authority will inform the Bidder of a time frame within which to provide the information. Failure to provide the certifications or the additional information listed below within the time frame specified will render the bid non-responsive.

#### **5.2.1. Integrity Provisions – Required Documentation**

The Bidder, regardless of their status under the [Ineligibility and Suspension Policy](#), must provide the information requested at **Annex D to Part 5 of the Bid Solicitation** prior to contract award.

#### **5.2.2. Former Public Servant**

Contracts awarded to former public servants in receipt of a pension or a lump sum payment must bear the closest public scrutiny and reflect fairness in the spending of public funds.

### **6.1. Security Requirements**

**6.1.1.** There is no security requirement applicable to the Contract.

### **6.2. Statement of Work**

The Contractor must perform the Work in accordance with the Statement of Work at **Annex A**.

#### **6.2.1 Work Authorization Process – As-and-when Requested Services**

##### **6.2.1.1 Work Authorization:**

The Work or a portion of the Work to be performed under the Contract will be on an "as and when requested basis" using a Work Authorization (WA). The Work described in the WA must be in accordance with the scope of the Contract.

##### **6.2.1.2 Work Authorization Process:**

**6.2.1.2.1.** The Project Authority will provide the Contractor with a description of the work.

**6.2.1.2.2.** The WA will contain the details of the activities to be performed, a description of the deliverables, and a schedule indicating completion dates for the major activities or submission dates for the deliverables.

**6.2.1.2.3.** The Contractor must provide the Project Authority, within two (2) days of receipt, the proposed total estimated cost for performing the work and a breakdown of that cost, established in accordance with the Basis of Payment specified in the Contract.

**6.2.1.2.4.** The Contractor must not commence work until a WA authorized by the Project Authority has been received by the Contractor. The Contractor acknowledges that any work performed before a WA has been received will be done at the Contractor's own risk.

#### **6.2.2 Canada's Obligation – Portion of the Work – Work Authorizations**

Canada's obligation with respect to the portion of the Work under the Contract that is performed through work authorizations is limited to the total amount of the actual work performed by the Contractor.

### **6.3. Standard Clauses and Conditions**

#### **6.3.1. General Conditions**

[2010C](#) (2022-12-01), General Conditions – Services (Medium Complexity) apply to and form part of the Contract.

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All reference to the Minister of Public Works and Government Services Canada shall be deleted and replaced with the Minister of the Environment for the purposes of the Parks Canada Agency. All reference to the Department of Public Works and Government Services Canada shall be deleted and replaced with the Parks Canada Agency.

### **6.3.2. Supplemental General Conditions**

#### **6.3.2.1. Compliance with On-site Measures, Standing Orders, Policies, and Rules**

The Contractor must comply and ensure that its employees and subcontractors comply with all security measures, standing orders, policies or other rules in force at the site where the Work is performed.

### **6.4. Term of Contract**

#### **6.4.1. Period of the Contract**

The period of the Contract is from Date of Contract to September 30, 2024 inclusive.

#### **6.4.2. Option to Extend the Contract**

The Contractor grants to Canada the irrevocable option to extend the term of the Contract by up to one (1) additional one (1) year period from October 1, 2024 to September 30, 2025 inclusive under the same conditions. The Contractor agrees that, during the extended period of the Contract, it will be paid in accordance with the applicable provisions as set out in the Basis of Payment.

Canada may exercise this option at any time by sending a written notice to the Contractor before the expiry date of the Contract. The option may only be exercised by the Contracting Authority, and will be evidenced for administrative purposes only, through a contract amendment.

### 6.7. Payment

#### 6.7.1. Basis of Payment: Cost reimbursable – Limitation of expenditure

The Contractor will be paid for its costs reasonably and properly incurred in the performance of the Work, in accordance with the Basis of payment in **annex B**, to a limitation of expenditure of \$ **\*\*\* to be inserted at contract award \*\*\***. 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## **6.7.2. Limitation of Expenditure**

The Contractor must not perform any work or provide any service that would result in Canada's totally liability being exceeded before obtaining writing approval of the Contracting Authority. The Contractor must notify the Contracting Authority in writing as to the adequacy of this sum:
- a. when it is 75 percent committed, or
  - b. four months before the contract expiry date, or
  - c. as soon as the Contractor considers that the contract funds provided are inadequate for the completion of the Work,
- whichever comes first.
- 6.7.2.3.** If the notification is for inadequate contract funds, the Contractor must provide to the Contracting Authority, a written estimate for the additional funds required. Provision of such information by the Contractor does not increase Canada's liability.

## **6.7.3. Monthly Payment**

Canada will pay the Contractor on a monthly basis for work performed during the month covered by the invoice in accordance with the payment provisions of the Contract if:

- a. an accurate and complete invoice and any other documents required by the Contract have been submitted in accordance with the invoicing instructions provided in the Contract;
- b. all such documents have been verified by Canada;
- c. the Work performed has been accepted by Canada.

**2.1 Labour**

The Contractor will be paid for the actual hours worked at the firm hourly rates detailed below.
