

### Highlights of the Industry Feedback on Context, APP3.0 and Solicitation Components

#### Context

- Industry does not understand:
  - why Canada is moving away from FA
  - why only 2 vendors
  - the overall Cloud strategy and approach being create by SSC with the different procurement vehicles.

### **APP3.0**

 Confusion as to the stages of procurement, timelines and why the documents are not all fully defined

# Solicitation Components

- Industry is seeking clarity on:
  - the Challenged-based solicitation, and how it can still create vendor competition and fairness.
  - GC workload requirements, desired outcomes and missing use cases.
  - when Industry will be able to negotiate T&Cs.

### **Highlights of the Industry Feedback on Prequalification**

# Fairness and Clarity

- Perception of favoritism towards larger CSPs
- Unclear definitions
- Ambiguity around terms

### Security, Encryption, and Data Sovereignty

- > 2 distinct perspectives:
  - one advocating for exclusive access to Canadian CSPs
  - other favoring a broader approach.
- More details on security and encryption assessment framework
- More flexibility in data residency and sovereignty.

### Confidentiality

Concerns to share certain evidences requested by SSC to demonstrate their capacity. Clarify that by default, bids are classified at a minimum as "Protected A" and are not shared with the public.

# Framework Agreement

- ➤ 2 opposing views:
  - Some vendors are worried that existing FA holders will be unduly favored.
  - Others would like to be deemed prequalified based on their status of FA holder.

### **Capacity-Based Evaluation for Prequalification**

# Directive on the Management of Procurement

- 3.2.1 Procurements are managed in a manner that enables operational outcomes
- Canada is developing evaluation framework to select vendors that have the capacity to produce the expected outcomes under the contract.
- A demanding evaluation criteria is not to be confused with an unfair evaluation criteria.
- A demanding evaluation criteria reflects the true need of the GC


#### **SSC** commitment toward fairness

Evaluation criteria will be:

- Clearly defined, observable, or measurable and demonstratable to ensure transparency and openness of the bid solicitation process.
- Aligned with the requirement being competed.
- Open, not overly restrictive. The criteria will be described to ensure the Bidder has the capacity to perform the contract.



### **Additional Clarity on Security Obligations**



- Revised draft of Appendix A Schedule
  1 Security Obligations for PBMM HVA
  posted on April 19 for information
- HVA clauses will be consulted with industry during ItR Wave 2 with prequalified vendors
- The timing of compliance with Appendix A will be determined during the ItR Wave 2 (e.g., at contract award or at bid closing)

### **Definition of Bidder**



- Definition of Bidder in the initial CBS: the person or entity (or, in the case of a joint venture, the persons or entities) submitting a bid to perform a contract for goods, services or both.
- Revised definition: the person or entity (or, in the case of a joint venture, the persons or entities) that is the originator of the Public Cloud Service in its entirety submitting a bid to perform a contract for goods, services or both.


### **Proposed Incremental Selection Process**

- 1. At the prequalification stage:
- Capacity of the Bidder to sell Commercially Infrastructure-as-a-Service (laaS) AND Platform-as-a-Service (PaaS) (mandatory)
- Capacity of the Bidder's solution to secure Canada's Data (mandatory)
- Capacity to satisfy data residency requirements (rated)
- Capacity of the Bidder's Solution to protect Canada's data (rated)
- Experience of the Bidder to provide laaS and Native PaaS services to large organizations (rated)
- Capacity of the Bidder to resolve the problem statement (rated)
- 2. At the Bid closing stage:
- ❖ To be determined at the next sprints with the prequalified vendors.

### **Prequalification Submission Form**

- To be considered, bidders must submit a Prequalification Submission Form (PSF)
- Download the form and use Adobe Reader to open the PSF.
- Note that the PSF may be updated and reissued should there be any necessary changes identified during the question period.

### **Pre-bid compliance check process (optional)**

**Object of the Process**: The Pre-Bid Compliance Check is a voluntary opportunity for bidders to submit draft responses to mandatory requirements for preliminary review by Canada.

**How to Submit:** Bidders may submit a Pre-Bid via email, using the Prequalification Submission Form (PSF) to the Contracting Authority. Only Part A – Prequalification Mandatory Criteria of the PSF will be reviewed by Canada.

**Submission Timeline:** A Pre-Bid must be submitted by May 15, 2024 11:59 p.m. to be considered for review, with only one submission per bidder.

Feedback Provision: Canada will provide confidential feedback, called a Preliminary Evaluation Notice (PEN), to bidders based on the Pre-Bid submissions



**Feedback for Deficiencies:** Written feedback highlighting deficiencies will be shared with the bidder, without corrective guidance or further discussion.

**Feedback for No Deficiencies**: If no deficiencies are found during Canada's review of a Pre-Bid, a "nil" response will be provided to the bidder.

### Posting of Prequalification CBS : April 19, 2024:

- Pre-bid compliance check process (optional) no later than May 15, 2024, 11:59 p.m. EDT
- Question period: 5 days prior to CBS Prequalification closing date
- Prequalification CBS closing: May 13, 2024, 2:00 p.m. EDT

### **Next Steps with prequalified bidders (Tentative)**

- Spring and Summer 2024: Invitation to Refine with prequalified vendors
- End of August 2024: Final Draft CBS posted
- September 2024: Final CBS posted
- October 2024: Bid Closing
- February 2025: Contract Award
