- 4. Insurance Proceeds

In the event of a claim, the Contractor must, without delay, do such things and execute such documents as are necessary to effect payment of the proceeds.

5. Deductible

The payment of monies up to the deductible amount made in satisfaction of a claim must be borne by the Contractor.

Where the Contractor or the Contractor's employees are providing services on government premises pursuant to this Contract and the said premises become non accessible due to evacuation or closure of government offices, and consequently no Work is being performed as a result of the closure, Canada will not be liable for payment to the Contractor for the period of closure.



GENERAL INFORMATION

As part of the installation of the wash section of the paint production line, the Correctional Service of Canada, CORCAN, requires the services of a contractor to replace a wash unit in its paint shop located at the Donnacona Institution at 1537 Route 138, Donnacona, Quebec.

SCOPE OF WORK

The contractor must perform the dismantling, fabrication and installation of a new stainless steel wash unit and the structure that includes a tunnel by providing the necessary materials and labour. The work must be carried out as per the drawing.

The wash unit represents the wash basin or washer for the paint line.

The work will be carried out in two phases. The first phase will involve the manufacturing and delivering a wash basin and structure including a tunnel, and the second phase will involve dismantling the existing tank and installing the new tank. It must be noted that the date of work will be determined jointly with the project authority and will preferably be between April and August for logistical reasons. The duration of the installation will be a maximum of three (3) weeks. Commissioning will occur once work is completed.

The drawings form part of the statement of work and are to be used as references for the evaluation of the scope of work in its entirety.

The contractor must:

Phase 1:

Manufacture the wash unit basin and structure, which includes the necessary equipment and delivery.

<u>Basin</u>

- o 3/16" thick corrosion-resistant stainless steel manufacturing equipment
- Basin size: length 120" × width 82 ½" × height 40"

The basin must include: A hole for pump positioning; and An access hatch and screen to allow the addition of water or other products.

Structure and tunnel

- Manufacture structure similar in size to existing unit (length 29 ft. × width 5.5 ft. × height 7.5 ft. approximately) designed to be self-supporting and capable of supporting section of rail (previous point).
- Manufacture the tunnel section to accommodate the wash nozzles and allow drainage into a basin below.
- The cab must be designed to allow connection to the existing ventilation system.
- The work must accommodate the heating coil (existing unit).
- The structural and tunnel materials must be made of stainless steel or any other material with an equivalent lifespan.
- The work includes shop drawings, programming and quality control.



Phase 2:

2.1 Dismantling:

- Disassemble and dispose of the old washing unit.
- Dismantle and dispose of unserviceable ducts at work locations.

2.2 Installation:

o Install the new wash unit to allow connection of electrical equipment, gas, plumbing and ventilation.

*Note that the suspended rail section must be supported during dismantling and installation.

Upon completion of the work, the contractor must:

• Commission the system.

Shop drawings:

The contractor must submit shop drawings in four copies, or in digital format, for approval five working days after contract award.

Details:

Work related to the disconnection and connection of electrical, gas, plumbing, and ventilation equipment related to the existing wash unit will be done by CORCAN.

Working hours: 8:30 a.m. to 3:30 p.m., Monday to Friday.

The contractor must pay particular attention to the safety measures issued by the Institution and comply with them at all times.

All employees of the supplier or its subcontractors who require access to CSC facilities must complete the "Institutional Access Form." CSC reserves the right to refuse supplier employees who do not meet its minimum security standards. No monetary compensation will be granted to the supplier for employees who are denied access.

LANGUAGE OF DOCUMENTS BEARING A SEAL

The official language of the original sealed documents (drawings, specifications or reports or any combination thereof) to be used, referred to or relied upon by the contractor in the performance of the work must be French.


