1.0 SCOPE

1.1 Purpose.

1.1.1 To supply and deliver five (5) federated Roll-On/Roll-Off (RORO)/ portable Aircraft Power Conversion and Distribution Kits (PCDK), including priced options for an additional five (5) PCDK, to support Royal Canadian Air Force (RCAF) CC-130J aircraft mission requirements.

1.2 Background

1.2.1 The CC130J is known as the Workhorse of the RCAF, steadily performing operations both nationally and internationally. It is tasked to perform a vast array of mission types including Tactical airlift, Search and Rescue, support to other governmental organisations, and medical support to name a few. With this variety of user demands, Canada requires the ability to convert CC130J aircraft power to "household" power during flight activities to support user operation of auxiliary electronic devices and accessories in the aircraft's cargo area.

1.3 Intended Use

1.3.1 The PCDK are required to convert CC130J aircraft power to 115V/60Hz/single phase power for employment of auxiliary electronic equipment in the CC130J cargo compartment, such as small refrigerators, medical devices, computer equipment, portable personal electronic devices, etc., to facilitate the aircraft's various mission requirements.

- 3.1.9.1 The PCDK shall convert CC130J aircraft power (115/200VAC, 400Hz, 3 Phase) to 115VAC, 60Hz, 1 Phase.
- 3.1.9.2 The PCDK shall plug directly into the available aircraft 4-pin power outlet located on the cargo department.
- 3.1.10 The contractor must supply an electronic user manual for the PCDK.
- 3.1.11 The contractor must supply an electronic maintenance manual, including a troubleshooting guide as a minimum, for the PCDK.
- 3.1.12 The contractor should supply a costed option of recommended initial spare parts to sustain 5 (five) PCDK for a 2-year period.
- 3.1.13 Costed option for an In-Service Support for a 4-year period at Canada's discretion based on hourly rates for Additional Work Requests (as defined in section 5) that may be required to sustain the capability.
- 3.1.14 Material Marking: Each aircraft power converter should be labeled with barcoding that conforms to NATO standards.
- 3.1.15 The contractor must provide at least 1-year warranty on all deliverables from the date of delivery.
- 3.1.16 The Contractor must provide the following airworthiness documentation, for each unit of issue, within the interior packaging or attached to the good(s) supplied: packing slip and documentation of achieved flight authority/clearance applicable to the C-130J.

3.2 Tasks

- 3.2.1 The Contractor must deliver and provide:
 - a) Equipment and priced options identified in Section 6.0 Deliverables; and
 - b) Priced options for in-service support as measured by Additional Work Request (AWR) (as defined in section 5) hourly rate as defined herein.
- 3.2.2 Notwithstanding any specialized on-site visits identified in Section 3.1.13, the Contractor must perform the work at the Contractor's facility.
- 3.2.3 The Contractor must deliver all goods to the Technical Authority:

4.0 ACCEPTANCE PROCESS AND CRITERIA

4.1 General

4.1.1 Acceptance ensures that each PCDK has been produced and verified in accordance with all the requirements of the Contract.

4.2 Acceptance Inspection

- 4.2.1 The Contractor must provide Canada with not less than 45 calendar days' notification of the date upon which each PCDK will be available for inspection and acceptance.
- 4.2.2 The Contractor must prepare the release document in accordance with article 6.4.5 Quality Assurance of the Contract for each PCDK, stating that the Work is in accordance with Annex A and all its appendices.
- 4.2.3 On completion of Canada's inspection, Canada will either:
- 4.2.3.1 Accept the PCDK by completing and signing the release document in accordance with Article 6.4.5 Quality Assurance of the Contract; or
- 4.2.3.2 Refuse to accept the PCDK by providing the Contractor with a notice of refusal, which will specify the grounds for refusal.
- 4.2.4 If Canada gives the Contractor a notice of refusal, the Contractor must take corrective action as soon as possible, at no cost to Canada, to remove the grounds for the refusal. Canada will conduct re-inspection as is necessary to ensure that the grounds for refusal are removed.

5.0 ADDITIONAL WORK REQUEST (AWR) AUTHORIZATIONS

- AWRs are defined as unforeseen requests for goods and services not specifically identified in the SOW. The contractor shall provide support for AWRs on an "as and when required" basis. AWRs will be authorized by the Contracting Authority and priced individually in accordance with the terms of the contract. Examples of AWRs include the following:
 - a) Remote technical support: Contractor must provide a phone number for technical support that can be reached between Monday to Friday 9:00-15:00 eastern standard time. If any specialized on-site visits are required at 8 Wing Trenton, they shall be considered as AWRs.
 - b) **Repair and Overhaul:** Repairable parts will be shipped to the Contractor's facility and the contractor will provide Rough Order of Magnitude (ROM) cost upon receiving the parts.
