2. In the case of an identical resource or identical resources proposed by more than one bidder

Following validation of the consent or proof of employment, if the successful bidder's proposed resource withdraws or becomes unable to provide the services before the contract award, the resource will no longer be considered from any other bidder who offered that same resource for the performance of the contract.

3. Replacement of a resource prior to contract award

If the successful bidder's proposed resource recommended for the contract award withdraws and/or becomes unable to provide its services for the performance of the contract, at any time between the closing date and time of the RFP and the award of the contract, the bidder must immediately inform the contracting authority of the reason for the replacement.

The bidder must propose, at the same hourly rate indicated in its bid, one replacement who must meet all of the mandatory requirements contained in the RFP and, if applicable, obtains an equal or higher score obtained by the originally proposed resource on the point rated criteria of the RFP. Upon request by the contracting authority and within the time allowed (minimum of one business day), the bidder must provide the necessary information to allow assessment of the replacement, including but not limited to, its name, qualifications and experience. Failure to respond to the request will result in the bid being declared non-responsive.

4. Bid challenge and recourse mechanisms

Several mechanisms are available to potential suppliers to challenge aspects of the procurement process up to and including contract award.

Canada encourages suppliers to first bring their concerns to the attention of the Contracting Authority. Canada's <u>Buy and Sell</u> website, under the heading "<u>Bid Challenge and Recourse Mechanisms</u>" contains information on potential complaint bodies such as:

4.0 Security requirement

4.1 Use of individual protective equipment and Occupational Health and Safety (OHS) guideline(s)

The Contractor warrants that its resources will follow at all times the OHS guidelines in force in the workplace during the contract period. Canada reserves the right to modify the OHS guideline, if required, to include any future recommendations proposed by the Public Health Agencies.

5.0 Term of contract

5.1 Period of contract

The period of the contract is from May 23 2023 to April 22 2024

5.2 Maximum duration of contracts

A contract awarded under the THS for the NCR supply arrangement must not exceeds 48 consecutive weeks including all absences.

On an exceptional basis only, a contract may be amended to extend the duration of an assignment period up to a maximum of 24 consecutive weeks beyond the limit of 48 consecutive weeks (example total extended duration must not exceed 72 consecutive weeks) on the condition that the following requirements are met:

- i. the duration of the assignment period, including any contract amendments that impact the assignment period, must be more than 40 consecutive weeks;
- ii. the amendment to extend the duration of the assignment period must be issued after the first 40 consecutive weeks of the assignment period; and
- iii. the contracting authority must notify THS for the NCR of the issued amendment by email within 2 business days of issuing the amendment.

The contractor agrees that, during the extended periods of the contract, it will be paid in accordance with the applicable provisions as set out in Annex B: Basis of payment.

6.0 Authorities

6.1 Contracting authority

The contracting authority for the contract is:

The contracting authority is responsible for the management of the contract and any changes to the contract must be authorized in writing by the contracting authority. The contractor must not perform work in excess of or outside the scope of the contract based on verbal or written requests or instructions from anybody other than the contracting authority.

8.0 Payment

8.1 Basis of payment

The contractor will be paid for the actual hours worked at the firm hourly rates in Annex B: Basis of payment. The contractor will be paid an initial half hour minimum charge calculated from the time the contractor's employee arrives on-site. Customs duties are included and applicable taxes are extra.

8.1.1 Travel and living expenses

Canada will not accept any travel and living expenses incurred by the contractor in the performance of the work, for:

8.2 Method of payment

Canada will pay the contractor on a monthly basis for work performed during the month covered by the invoice in accordance with the payment provisions of the contract if:

- an accurate and complete invoice and any other documents required by the contract have been submitted in accordance with the invoicing instructions provided at 8.2.1 below;
- all such documents have been verified by Canada;
- the work performed has been accepted by Canada.

8.2.1 Invoices

9.0 Certifications compliance

Unless specified otherwise, the continuous compliance with the certifications provided by the contractor in its bid or precedent to contract award, and the ongoing cooperation in providing additional information are conditions of the contract and failure to comply will constitute the contractor in default. 9.1 Compliance with on-site measures, standing orders, policies, and rules

12.0 Discretionary audit - non-commercial goods and/or services

The estimated amount of profit included in the contractor's price or rate certification is subject to audit by Canada, before or after payment is made to the contractor under the conditions of the contract. The purpose of the audit would be to determine whether the actual profit earned on a single contract if only one exists, or the aggregate of actual profit earned by the contractor on a series of negotiated firm price and fixed-time rate contracts performed during a particular period selected, is reasonable and justifiable based on the estimated amount of profit included in earlier price or rate certification(s).

If the audit demonstrates that the actual profit is not reasonable and justifiable, as defined above, the contractor must repay Canada the amount found to be in excess.

13.0 Foreign nationals (Canadian contractor)

The contractor must comply with Canadian immigration requirements applicable to foreign nationals entering Canada to work temporarily in fulfillment of the contract. 15.0 Insurance

ANNEX A - Statement of work

1. Scope

DND/CAF supports and sustains a variety of Information Management (IM) platforms with a plan to fully transition onto the Microsoft (MS) 365 platform and decommission legacy IM platforms (i.e. GCDocs/RDIMS, Share Drives and SharePoint OnPrem). This contract is to provide IM professional services in the form of functional expertise to this effect.

1.1. Objective

The objective of this request is to ensure the correct identification and development of IM features and capabilities within the MS 365 environment, supporting the deployment and sustainment of IM solutions, and the migration of legacy information from a myriad of IM platforms onto a single repository – MS 365.

1.2. Background

Assistant Deputy Minister – Information Management (ADM IM) group in the Department of National Defence/Canadian Armed Forces (DND/CAF) has a responsibility to ensure the lifecycle of information is in compliance and managed effectively and efficiently in accordance with legislative requirements, Treasury Board policy and standards, and that IT systems and data, and IM products and processes, are aligned to drive all business decisions through accuracy, accessibility, and timely provision. As part of the MS 365 rollout, DND/CAF has a requirement to migrate its information and users from a myriad of platforms onto a single repository –MS 365 that is aligned with the established Defense 365 IM design and configurations.

Legacy content are safeguarded using various platforms - OpenText Document Management/Records Management (DM/RM) which is referred to as GCDocs (Content Server), eDocs also referred to as RDIMS, Shared Drives, and Microsoft SharePoint OnPrem.

To better address IM requirements within this new platform, and to allow the DND/CAF to better manage its information, it is essential to create an implementable MS 365 IM/IT platform that will allow DND/CAF to properly manage its information from creation to disposition/transfer.

2. Requirement

The purpose of this contract is to provide IM professional services in the form of functional non-technical expertise to support the implementation of D365 as the new cloud-based solution for Information Management (IM) in the DND/CAF, and in the decommissioning of legacy IM platforms (i.e. GCDocs/RDIMS, Share Drives, and SharePoint OnPrem) via the development and rollout of commensurate and superior IM capabilities.

2.1. Scope of work

The scope of this contract will cover the analysis and implementation of D365 IM features and the generation of detailed IM requirements in collaboration with clients (IMOs/IAs), stakeholders (IMGS, D365 Training, IM Legacy Support), and technical/security teams (DEIMS and D365 Program pillars).
