Α. **Questions and Answers**

- Q1: Can more information be provided about what has been undertaken already and how many more hours of research and engagement are expected
- A1: Previous work includes approximately 30 oral interviews with verbatim transcripts averaging 35 pages each. In addition to this there are two Parks Canada research documents totaling 133 pages and 28 pages respectively. Additional reference documents and archeological reports may be available if required for further context.
- Q2: For whom is the final report and how will it deepen knowledge on multi-generational impacts of park establishment? Can you add any information to clarify intended use of the report and what impacts Parks Canada is anticipating?
- A2: The final report is for Parks Canada and will be shared with local Indigenous communities. The intent is to gather multiple perspectives and narratives about the impact of the park's establishment on local Indigenous communities in one place. A primary result of this project will be to continue to work with local indigenous partners to identify which stories are told and the ways they are told to foster a more representative understanding of current and past histories, cultures, and realities for local indigenous communities and individuals.
- Q3: Are there already Indigenous communities in partnership, engaged and in agreement to contributing to this three-month phase of work, or is more community engagement needed to ensure genuine connection is achieved to receive wisdom in appropriate, good, and meaningful ways?
- A3: Engagement with communities has been continual and consistent throughout the phases of this project and will be maintained during the completion of this project as needed. Contractor will coordinate with Parks Canada if additional engagement is required to fill gaps in oral history information currently available. Engagement to review the final report will be coordinated by Parks Canada. Please refer to Statement of Work for additional information regarding this.
