Description:

The Royal Canadian Mounted Police (RCMP) requires services for grounds maintenance and landscaping at the M Division Whitehorse Detachment/compound. The work covered under this Service Contract comprises the furnishing of all labor, materials, tools and equipment required to provide grounds maintenance and landscaping services at the M Division Whitehorse Detachment/compound when requested and as specified herein.

The contract period will be for one year from the date of contract with an irrevocable option to extend it for up to three additional one-year periods. The anticipated start date is April 1, 2024.

This procurement is subject to the Umbrella Final Agreement which encompasses 11 CLCAs in the Yukon. The affected agreement for the area in which the service will be provided:

Security Requirements

The Contractor/Offeror personnel must hold a valid RCMP Facility Access Level 1 Status, granted or approved by the RCMP.

Mandatory Site Visit:

It is mandatory that the Bidder or a representative of the Bidder visit the work site. Arrangements have been made for the site visit to be held at 4100 4th Avenue, Whitehorse, YT on 10 August, 2023. The site visit will begin at 09:00 PDST.

Bidders must communicate with the Contracting Authority no later than 7 August 2023, 14:00 PDST to confirm attendance and provide the name(s) of the person(s) who will attend. Bidders will be required to sign an attendance sheet. Bidders should confirm in their bid that they have attended the site visit. Bidders who do not attend the mandatory site visit or do not send a representative will not be given an alternative appointment and their bid will be declared non-responsive. Any clarifications or changes to the bid solicitation resulting from the site visit will be included as an amendment to the bid solicitation.

Basis of selection: The lowest cost per point bid will be recommended for award of the contract.
